New Landscaping Restrictions

Starting this Spring, commercial landscape contractors will be prohibited from working in the Village of Lincolnshire on any and all Sundays. Village residents and property owners who utilize the services of professional landscaping companies should inform their landscape providers that they are not permitted to work on Sundays in Lincolnshire.

Spring Cleanup, Sat., April 21st

Start preparing now for the Annual Spring Cleanup. It will be held on Saturday, April 21st.

Residents may put out household goods with the exception of "white goods" (appliances), household chemical waste and landscape waste. Items such as carpet or lumber must be bundled in lengths not more than 4 feet long and two feet in diameter. All items must be of such a size that one person can lift them.

All goods must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the morning of the pickup. Residents may begin placing items at the curb after 7:00 p.m. the night before.

Recent Village Board Action

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of February 26, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved an Ordinance amending Title 3, Business and License Regulations, Title 5, Building Regulations, and Title 8, Public Ways and Property, of the Lincolnshire Village Code, to address contractor and site construction regulations.
- Approved a Resolution for Construction on State Highways for Fiscal Years 2007 and 2008.
- Approved a Resolution for Maintenance of Streets and Highways by Municipality Under the Illinois Highway Code - January 1, 2007 to December 31, 2007.
- Approved a letter to support the relocation of Londonderry Lane due to wetland impacts for the Oaks of Lincolnshire.
- Approved the lowest responsible bid in an amount not to exceed \$67,360 from M-C Sport Systems of Franklin Park, IL, for the resurfacing the Balzer Park tennis courts.
- Approved the lowest responsible bid in an amount not to exceed \$24,369 from Fox Valley Fence Company of Cortland, IL, for the replacement of an historic district fence.
- Approved an Ordinance amending Title 3-3 of the Village Code (Liquor Control) cancelling a Class "B" and Class "J" liquor licenses due to the closing of the Great Lakes Fish House Restaurant.

- Approved an amendment to extend the Downtown Redevelopment Agreement with Colliers, Bennett & Kahnweiler to June 30, 2007.

- Approved a Pre-Closing Possession Agreement to permit limited access to the Downtown Project Area by Colliers, Bennett & Kahnweiler to do soil boring.

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of March 12th, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved an Ordinance Making Appropriations to Defray All Necessary Expenses and Liabilities of the Village of Lincolnshire, Lake County, Illinois, for the Fiscal Year Beginning the First Day of January, 2007 and Ending the 31st day of December, 2007.
- Approved revisions to the Flood Response Manual
- Approved wording changes to tennis court regulations.
- Approved the lowest responsible bid from Fuerte Systems, Plainfield, IL, in an amount not to exceed \$29,436.44 for the Memorial Park pavers installation.
- Approved an Ordinance Amending Title 6-3-7, Yards, of the Village of Lincolnshire's General Zoning Regulations, to consider the continued applicability of the conditions related to maintaining an average setback for residential buildings.

Spring & Tornadoes

The snow may be on its last legs, but just around the corner is tornado season. While there is little you can do to minimize property damage, you can save your life by knowing what to do.

A Severe Thunderstorm Watch means that severe weather is a possibility. **A Severe Thunderstorm Warning** means that severe weather is in the immediate area. **A Tornado Watch** means that conditions are present which could produce a tornado. **A Tornado Warning** means that a tornado has been sighted and that you should be ready to take shelter. Tornadoes are accompanied by hail, thunderstorms and wind.

During potentially severe weather keep tuned to a radio station that gives frequent weather updates for your area. If a tornado threatens Lincolnshire you will hear the emergency warning sirens. **Take shelter immediately.**

If a tornado has been sighted, take cover in the safest place possible. If you have a basement, go there and avoid windows and chimneys. Hide under a stairwell or heavy furniture. Cover your head. If you live in a split-level home, go to the lowest level.

If you don't have a basement, go to the central portion of the building, and to an interior closet or hallway, away from windows. You should have a flashlight and battery operated radio with you as well as your keys.

If lightning strikes, try to get inside a home, building or vehicle, or go to a low place such as a ravine or ditch. Avoid using the telephone, if possible. Do not stand in small sheds or other small structures in open areas.

Avoid tall, isolated trees in open areas. Don't stand so that you project above the surrounding landscape. Stay away from open water, and avoid golf carts and clubs, motorcycles, bicycles, wire fences, metal pipes, rails or other metallic items which could carry lightning to you from some distance away.

Transmission Main Construction

The Village of Lincolnshire's new 30 inch diameter water transmission main is under construction. The \$4.5 million project will provide the Village with an adequate water supply in the future.

The new line generally parallels Route 22 from the Illinois Tollway to its connection in Highland Park. Due to the proximity to the roadway, there may be traffic delays along Route 22. Motorists are urged to allow extra time while proceeding through the construction zone. Work is expected to be completed on the project in early summer. The following materials are typical household chemical wastes that are usually included in a one day HCW drop-off event. To help you determine if something is a household chemical waste, look for the words "danger," "toxic," "flammable," "corrosive," and/or "reactive" somewhere on the product's packaging.

Materials **ACCEPTED** at HCW collections: oil-based paint, solvents, old prescriptions, motor oil, household cleaners, household batteries (alkaline and rechargeable), antifreeze, garden/lawn chemicals, pool chemicals, asbestos, old gasoline, fungicides, insecticides, pesticides, metal polishes, paint remover, driveway sealer, drain cleaner, aerosol products, hobby chemicals, mercury (including thermometers and thermostats).

Latex paint will **NOT** be accepted at any of the Agency's HCW events. Other materials not accepted include business wastes, farm chemicals, propane tanks, lead-acid batteries, explosives, medical wastes, fire extinguishers, and smoke detectors.

New Tennis Court Rules



Spring is here and activity in the Village parks will increase. Please be aware that there are some new rules for use of the Village tennis courts. One which is particularly important - Teaching of tennis lessons on Village courts is only allowed if you are a resident teaching another family member. Rack-up rules are posted at each of the Village tennis courts. Because the rules are slightly different, depending upon whether there is a single court or there are multiple courts, please be sure to read the rules carefully. Following is an example of one set of rack-up rules:

1. Only Lincolnshire Residents or their guests may rack up.
2. You must rack up in person. You may not rack up for anyone else.
3. You may only rack up during the one hour period prior to the desired time.
4. You must be present while your racket is holding court.
5. You may not rack up on a second court while you are playing.
6. You must have a two person minimum to hold a court.
7. Even # courts must be vacated every hour on the hour. Odd # courts must be vacated every hour on the half hour.
8. Absolutely no bicycles, skateboards, or vehicular traffic is allowed on the courts. Any violation will be considered an act of vandalism and subject to penalties under the law.
9. Practice sessions shall not interfere with adjoining courts.
10. The teaching of tennis lessons is prohibited with the exception of a Lincolnshire resident, teaching a family member. (Proof of identification may be required).
11. No individual, organization, or entity of any kind shall use the Village's park and/or park facilities in the course of any for-profit activity.

Building Construction in the Floodplain or Floodway



Structures located in the floodplain or floodway are subject to additional building regulations designed to protect not only the structure but also the floodplain. If you are contemplating a modification to your existing home, contact the Village before starting your design so that you understand the regulations before you get too far along in the process. Please remember that ANY modification to a structure in the floodplain may require a permit.

You may be able to construct an addition to a structure in the floodplain. In general, the cost of the addition must be less than fifty-percent of the value of the structure itself. This regulation is known as the Substantial Improvement rule. It is designed to limit the exposure of damage to structures in the floodplain. If the cost of the proposed addition would exceed the fifty-percent threshold, then the entire structure must be brought into compliance with the floodplain regulations.

Additions to structures in the floodplain may be located above the existing footprint or may expand the footprint of the structure. If the footprint is expanded, the additional area must comply with the floodplain requirements, which typically requires that the addition be elevated. You may not expand the footprint of structures in the floodway.

Now you can Vote Early

Early Voting has arrived! Early voting will be offered to any eligible voter, without reason (i.e. not required to be absent, physically disabled, etc.).

Early Voting in the Consolidated Election of April 17th began on Monday, March 26th, and runs through Thursday, April 12th. Voters are required to present a valid Illinois driver's license, an Illinois identification card issued by the Secretary of State, or any other government-issued identification document containing their photograph, name and address.

You can "Vote Early" at the Vernon Township Building, 3050 N. Main Street, Buffalo Grove, IL 60089, or at the Lake County Administrative Offices, 10 N. County Street, Waukegan, IL 60085.

Campaign Signage

The Village Code regulates the size of political signs. The maximum size for political signs is six square feet, which is the size of a standard 2 x 3 foot sign. It cannot be any higher than four feet off the ground.



All political signs must be displayed no more than 36 days prior to and removed within 2 days after an election. Since the election is on Tuesday, April 17th this year, no political signs should have been displayed before Monday, March 12th, and they should be taken down by Thursday, April 19th. Since the wastehaulers come through the Village on Wednesday, April 18th, it's a good idea to take the signs out of your yard and put them at the curb at the same time you put your waste and recyclables there.

Signs must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowner. Private property typically begins fifteen feet from the roadway. Rights-of-way along roads such as Riverwoods Road, Route 22, and Milwaukee Avenue are not private property. Any signage along these roadways must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowners. Any signage not meeting this criteria will be removed by the Village staff.

Disaster Plan Update

The Village's Disaster Preparedness Plan was originally developed in 1988. This comprehensive review and revision have been in the works for months. Each of the various village departments have reviewed and updated their specific sections (Annexes) of the plan which are pertinent to their specific operations and/or oversight. In addition, sections of the plan specific to outside agencies such as the Fire Department, Health Department and Coroner's Office, have also been reviewed and updated.



The vast majority of the changes were minor such as telephone number updates, title changes, and in the resources list, company information updates. The only substantive changes were the incorporation of the NIMS (National Incident Management System) protocol throughout the plan and the reference to the new Connect-CTY community notification system recently approved by the Village Board.

Red Means Closed, Green Means Opened

Soon it will be time to play on the fields at North Park. The flag under the United States flag, at the entrance to the park, indicates whether the fields are open for play. The red flag, flying under the U.S. flag, means that the fields are closed. The green flag, flying under the U.S. flag, means the fields are open for play.

These flags are provided as a quick way of identifying whether the park is open for play simply by driving by the park. You can also call the North Park Hot Line at 847-295-0989 to get an update on field conditions each day.

Pesticides in Parks

The Village applies pesticides and fertilizer in Village parks. If you want to be notified when this will be occurring in a park you use, please call Wendy Moderhack at 847-883-8600. She will put your name on a list and contact you prior to any pesticide or fertilizer applications in the park.

Park Board - Park Improvements

The Park Board will be discussing improvements to Village parks at its April 16th regular meeting. Any interested residents are invited to attend this meeting and offer their comments or suggestions. Garage Sales

A Garage Sale Permit must be obtained from the Department of Community Development no less than 48 hours prior to the start of any garage sale. There is a \$50.00 refundable deposit required for the Garage Sale Permit, and the permit process will provide the Village the ability to better track the location and frequency of such sales. The permit will also outline all applicable regulations which must be followed in the conduct of such garage sales.

The number of allowable garage sales at each residence is no more than two (2) in any calendar year. In addition, off-site directional signs to direct buyers to the location of the garage sale are permitted. There are regulations limiting the number and specifying the placement of signs. This information can be obtained through the Department of Community Development.

The Village is permitting these changes on a trial basis, dependent upon the compliance rate with these regulations. Penalties will be assessed against anyone leaving off-site directional signs up past 6:00 p.m. Please be respectful of your neighbors and maintain the beautiful entrances to Lincolnshire's wonderful neighborhoods!



Crossing Guards are Back

Crossing Guards will again be at their posts on Monday, April 2nd, at Surrey Lane and Riverwoods Road, and Half Day Road, Yorkshire and Riverwoods Road, after a long absence over the winter.

Arbor Day Activities

In 1872, a pioneer by the name of J. Sterling Morton proposed a tree-planting holiday that he called "Arbor Day."

Morton, originally from Michigan, was a Nebraska Territory pioneer who realized the numerous benefits



that trees could provide for people living on the treeless central plains of America. Morton's idea spread rapidly, and in 1885 the state of Nebraska declared Arbor Day an official holiday. Many other states quickly followed suit, and today Arbor Day is a national holiday that is observed in most states on the last Friday of April.

This year Arbor Day falls of Friday, April 27th. In recognition of the importance of trees and nature, the Village will be holding an Arbor Day tree planting demonstration at the Buckingham Place center median (located a fi block south of Laura Sprague Elementary School). The tree planting activities will take place at 2:00 p.m. near the intersection of Buckingham Place and Kings Cross Drive. The Village Forester will on hand to share interesting information about trees and Arbor Day. We look forward to seeing you there.

Nature's Edge

The Cicadas are coming!



2007 is the year the periodical cicada comes out of the ground to mate. The last such mass appearance was in 1990. This 17 year cicada appearance will result in millions of cicadas inhabiting our woodlands and singing their love song.

Cicadas are insects known for the loud noise they make during the summer months. This noise is created by the male cicada who is singing to find a mate. Cicadas are the loudest insect in the world. They can create sounds in excess of 90 decibels!

In spring the female cicada will lay hundreds of eggs in grooves on tree branches. Many times this will kill the small branches causing the branch to fall from the tree. This is called flagging. Flagging is not dangerous for the tree. Once the eggs hatch, the nymphs fall to the ground and dig into the earth where they will feast on tree sap in the root systems of the trees for seventeen years. At the end of seventeen years, the nymph has finally reached maturity or the adult phase. Adults are between one and one-half and two inches in length. They have black bodies, colorful eyes and wings.

Male adult cicadas are the ones responsible for all of the noise. They are loudly singing to find a mate. Adult cicadas live for approximately four to six weeks. During that time they find their partner, mate and die. Once mating has taken place, the female lays hundreds of eggs and the process starts over.



Depending on our spring, we could see the emergence of the 17 year cicada in April or as late as June. There are more than 100 species of cicadas in North America. In addition to periodic cicadas (with life cycles 13 or 17 years in length), we also have annual cicadas.

Hydrant Flushing

The Village Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants throughout the Water Distribution System this month. Flushing will be done intermittently from 10:00 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. between April 8th and April 12th; April 15th and April 19th; and April 22nd and April 26th. The flushing of the fire hydrants serve several purposes: it cleans the pipe lines throughout the system, increases the amount of flow capacity, and allows department personnel to inspect the operation of each hydrant.

Please refrain from washing laundry during these hours as clothing could become stained. Residents with water softeners should also check the cycle time of their softeners so that the unit does not regenerate during this time period.

Village Wins GISC Award

The Chicago Metropolitan Chapter of the American Public Works Association named the Geographic Information System Consortium the winner of its 2007 Management Innovation Award.

The award recognizes an individual, team or organization for the development and implementation of a creative idea, device, process or system that enhances the goals of public works in serving the public and protecting the environment. The award is open to anyone actively involved in the public works profession.

The Village of Lincolnshire is a founding member of the GISC. Begun in 1999, the GISC is designed to overcome personnel and budget constraints which inhibit the development of geographic information systems (GIS). Unlike traditional associations of governmental agencies which exist to share data, typically among county and local communities, the GISC exists to share professional resources

which develop data and applications for the individual communities.

Combined purchasing power through partnerships with carefully selected service providers results in lower costs and enhanced services while reducing risk. Each member community maintains control of its own GIS program, including ownership of its data, software and establishment of program goals and tasks.

Twelve communities currently participate in the Consortium: the Villages of Deerfield, Glencoe, Glenview, Lincolnshire, Lincolnwood, Morton Grove, Norridge, Skokie, and Winnetka, and Cities of Des Plaines, Highland Park and Park Ridge.

Village Engineer Jennifer Hughes has served as the President of the GISC for the past four years after previously completing terms as Secretary and Vice President.
