Phase II of the Brampton Woods Subdivision Approved!

The Village Board recently approved Phase 2 of the Brampton Woods Subdivision, which will span a 16.8 acre property between Elm Road and Brampton Lane, west of Riverwoods Road. This is an 11-lot subdivision, that was actually agreed to as a future phase of the Brampton Woods subdivision in a 1989 Annexation Agreement.

The developer of the original phase of Brampton Woods, Arthur J. Greene Construction, is now undertaking this second phase, which will include three, new single-family homes on Brampton Lane, north of the existing home at 223 Brampton, as well as six homes on a new cul-de-sac from Elm Road. There are an additional two lots with existing farmstead homes that will also be part of this subdivision and will have access off the cul-de-sac road, which will be known as Hamilton Court. The builder/developer is anticipating completing engineering work this summer and beginning site work in the fall.

Given Arthur J. Greene's extensive homebuilding in the 1980's and 90's in Lincolnshire, the Village is confident that history and experience will lead to a high-quality subdivision, with a minimum of disruptions to our current residents.

Forest View Subdivision Approved

A 7-lot subdivision, on the south side of Route 22, midway between the intersections of Oxford Drive and Oakwood Lane, was approved by the Village Board on July 9th. This subdivision will be located on a long, narrow parcel of approximately 7.27 acres, with a detention pond at the southern end of the property, and a cul-de-sac street, known as Thornfields Lane. As part of this approval, the Village Board will require a screening fence and landscaping along the west property line of this subdivision, in order to provide a buffer between the existing rear yards of homes on Essex Lane and this new construction. There was considerable discussion regarding this proposed subdivision at the Zoning Board and at the Village Board. There was also concern voiced regarding the safe access to and from this subdivision at Route 22. While it was the majority opinion of both the Zoning Board and Village Board that a full access would be most appropriate, the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) has so far agreed only to a limited access that would permit right-turn movements into the site from Route 22, and right-turn movements out to Route 22. The developer continues to work with IDOT to alleviate these concerns.



Board Approves 36 unit Condominium

On July 9, 2007, the Village Board approved a proposal for a 36-unit condominium building as part of the final development phase of the Tri-State International Office Center. The 3-fi story, brick and stone condo building, known as the Walden Pond Condominiums, will be constructed on the vacant site directly south of the Homewood Suites hotel, and will fit well into a neighborhood consisting of single-family homes, townhouses, and an adjacent hotel. The condo building will offer a unique and high-quality architectural design, with views overlooking the large pond, underground parking and spacious floor plans. The Village looks forward to construction beginning on this project in late 2007/early 2008.

E-Mail & Viruses

As you are probably aware, some unscrupulous people send viruses through E-Mails. Because of this, Village employees who have access to computers and e-mail have been instructed to be very vigilant when opening E-Mails, and especially attachments, from sources they do not know. On the other hand, we invite our residents to E-Mail us if there is something we can help them with, which creates a dilemma.

A resident may send staff members E-Mails for which responses are expected. But if the Village staff members do not recognize the name, or if the E-Mail has a "handle" rather than a resident's actual name, they may be uncomfortable about opening it.

If you send E-Mails to staff members and do not get a response within 48 hours, we suggest you call them and ask them if they received your E-Mail. They may have deleted it to avoid any possibility of introducing a virus into the computer system.

School's Starting, Drive Carefully

The first day of school for School District 103 (Sprague, Half Day and Daniel Wright) is **August 27th** (two hours) and full days begin on **August 28th**. When driving, please watch your speed and make sure you do not make a right turn on red when pedestrians are present. Many children will be riding bikes, walking or rollerblading to school on Village streets while the weather is nice.

Please remind your children to cross at intersections and to look left, right, and then left again before crossing. Bicycles should be walked across all streets and ridden in the same direction the traffic is flowing.

Recent Village Board Action

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of June 25th, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved a revised Field Usage Policy and Classification "F".
- Approved a request for waiving of fees for minor building improvements for the Village Church of Lincolnshire.
- Approved an amendment to extend the Downtown Redevelopment Agreement with CBK to September, 2007.
- Approved a Final Plat of Subdivision for the proposed Manors of Brampton Woods-Unit II subdivision by Arthur J. Greene Construction Co.

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of July 9th, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved a request by CBK to designate the Lincolnshire Marketplace Planned Unit Development as an Area of Special Sign Control for the purpose of regulating signage throughout the site.
- Approved an Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 86-0866-03, which established a Special Use for a PUD for Phase II in the Tri-State International

Office Center in the B2 Zoning District, to permit the construction of a 36-unit condominium building, with zoning exceptions to permit a building height 2' taller than the B2 Zoning District permits and 2.25 parking spaces per unit rather than the code required 2.5 parking spaces per unit, for the property located at 20 Westminster Way.

- Approved an Architectural Review Board recommendation regarding the site plan, building elevations, building materials and colors, and landscape plan for a proposed 36-unit condominium building, located at 20 Westminster Way.
- Approved an Ordinance Granting a Rezoning of a 7.27 acre parcel from R-1 Single Family Residential to R-3 Single Family Residential for the proposed 7-lot Forest View Subdivision located at 13 Half Day Road.
- Approved a Preliminary Plat of Subdivision and Preliminary Engineering Improvement Plans for the Forest View Subdivision.

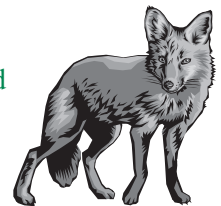
Village Offices Closed

Building Dept.- **B**Extended Hours

The Building Division, in the Community Development Department, is continuing an effort to increase the Village's customer's access to the Building Division's services, through a Pilot Program that will extend the Building Division's hours, on the second and fourth Wednesdays of the month, to 7:00 p.m. We believe this will be a good way to provide an additional level of customer service, especially to our residents who may be seeking smaller building permits but who would have to leave work early (and may be working downtown or at a location too distant to stop in over lunch) to handle such a matter.

These extended hours will provide the opportunity to submit a permit, pay for an approved permit, pick up permit application forms, and in some cases, ask a Building Official a question. The Pilot Program began on June 27th and will continue with extended hours on the second and fourth Wednesdays through September. If the program proves successful, the Village Board will consider it on a semi-permanent basis for selected months every year. We hope that our residents will take advantage of these additional hours and look forward to seeing some familiar faces, as well as many new ones, in the coming months.

Budget Process for Fiscal Year 2008

We have begun working on the new Budget that will guide the Village from January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. The following dates have been tentatively scheduled for resident input into this process:

Monday, September 10th

Residents and representatives of Village organizations are encouraged to attend this Committee of the Whole Meeting if there are particular projects or priorities they would like the Board to consider for Fiscal Year 2008. If you cannot attend, you may send a written request to the Village.

Month of November

The Mayor and Board of Trustees will establish special meetings during this month and will discuss a draft Budget. This draft, which will be available at the Village Hall and the Vernon Area Public Library for your review as of October 19th, will include personnel, programs, and capital expenditures.

Monday, November 12th

The Budget will appear as an item for discussion on the Committee of the Whole Meeting agenda. This will be your opportunity to comment on the document and on discussions by Board members at the previous week's Budget meetings.

Final Budget consideration and approval is expected to occur on December 10th.

Jewels of Lincolnshire - Our Parks!

North Park is the Village's premier athletic facility. This park has received regional and national awards for its outstanding design, construction and maintenance. Literally thousands of athletic events were held at North Park last year! In addition, to athletic events, North Park hosted numerous group and family gatherings and dozens of Village sponsored programs.

North Park has two tennis courts, a basketball court, playground, volleyball area, concession building, restrooms, two baseball diamonds, three softball fields, six to eight soccer fields, a picnic shelter, hockey rink, warming hut, figure skating area, and pedestrian path. In addition, North Park has an extensive natural area that is a dedicated Illinois Nature Preserve with interpretive signs and a trail system.

Spring Lake Park is the "heart of Lincolnshire". This park was the first Village Park and has hosted the 4th of July here in Lincolnshire for more than 50 years. This park is unique and is well known by residents and non-residents alike.

Spring Lake, in the center of the park, is a one acre lake that provides swimming on one end and fantastic catch and release fishing on the other. The swimming portion of the lake has a shallow end for young children and a deep area with a slide for older children and adults.

The park has a small baseball/softball field, one tennis court, a basketball court, pedestrian path system, playground, picnic area and restrooms.

Water Meter Reading Continues

The Village of Lincolnshire's Water Department personnel will be reading inside water meters for single family homes located **East of the Des Plaines River, West of Riverwoods Road, and South of Half Day Road**. Inspections will be performed from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, through the month of August. Inside meter readings are taken every third year to verify that the inside meter matches the outside meter readings. To eliminate the need to enter each house quarterly, the outside meter is read to determine the owner's water usage. This program assures you of the accuracy of the meter readings. This program includes a mandated inspection of your plumbing system and sump pump. The average time required per property is about ten minutes.

JULIE announced the launch of a new national 811 "Call Before You Dig" number to help prevent homeowners and professional excavators from damaging underground utility lines and causing injury or service outages while digging.

What is SWALCO?

The Village is a member of the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO). This agency exists to help reduce the stream of waste headed to our landfills by reduction, recycling and energy recovery. SWALCO sponsors household chemical waste and electronics collections as well as educational programs aimed at improving our environment. According to SWALCO, Lincolnshire residents recycled 999 tons of materials in 2005! That's more than 305 pounds per resident.

Illicit Discharge Elimination System

The Village of Lincolnshire is required to comply with the Phase II regulations of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) under the Clean Water Act. These regulations are designed to make our bodies of water even cleaner than they already are. The program targets homeowners and small businesses in an effort to stop them from disposing of pollutants improperly by releasing them directly into the environment or into a storm sewer. Storm sewers, unlike sanitary sewers, go directly into the nearest river without being treated. When enough household chemicals, such as used motor oil and antifreeze, make their way into our waterways, they can kill fish and plants living in or near the water.

As part of the NPDES, Lincolnshire will be stepping up its illicit discharge detection program, so be prepared to pay a fine for illegally dumping chemicals. The detection program involves inspecting the Village's storm sewers when they should be dry, such as during a summer dry spell. If liquid is found in the storm sewers, the liquid is traced to its source to determine the responsible party. In general, only rain water should be placed into storm sewers.

Spring Lake Beach Closes

Spring Lake Beach's regular season ends August 19th. It will be open again on August 25th and 26th, and on September 1, 2 and 3rd.

When lifeguards are not present, children under the age of seventeen are required to swim with the supervision of an adult. This is a state regulation and one which the Village supports.

Fire Safety Tips for Outdoor Grilling!



Outdoor grills can be fun to cook on and provide delicious food, but they can also be dangerous. Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) when used to fire a bar-b-que is contained under pressure in a steel cylinder and has the explosive force of several sticks of dynamite. A LPG burner should never be ignited until the following steps are taken:

Be sure you understand the manufacturer's instructions.

Do not transport a LPG cylinder in the trunk of a passenger vehicle. It should always be transported in an upright position on the floor of the vehicle with all windows open.

Never leave a cylinder in a parked vehicle.

Make sure that all connections are tight by applying a soapy solution to detect leaks. If any bubbles are produced, the connections must be tightened further.

Make sure that grease does not drip on the hose or cylinders.

Never use a gas-fired bar-b-que inside any structure.

Never store LPG inside any part of a structure, including porches and balconies. Only store cylinders outdoors in a shaded cool area out of direct sunlight.

Although **charcoal** may sound less dangerous than LP gas, it is just as necessary to take precautions when using charcoal burners.

Never use charcoal barbeques in an enclosed space as it emits carbon monoxide gas, which even in small quantities can cause injury or death.

Once a fire has been started, never add starter fluid. Fire may follow the stream of fluid back to the container, causing an explosion and scattering flaming liquid.

Use caution when disposing of ashes. Ashes may contain live coals which can start a fire. The safest method is to wet ashes thoroughly with water before emptying the barbeque.

Follow these precautions and enjoy outdoor eating in good health and happiness!

Important Contact Information

- **Sprinkling Restrictions - Outside water usage will be restricted in the Village between May 15th and September 15th.** If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8), then you may use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), you may use outside water on calendar days which are odd.
- **Dumping in drainage ditches** and detention basins is prohibited by Village Code. A fine will be assessed to anyone in violation. Questions? Call Jennifer Hughes, Village Engineer, at 847-883-8600.
- **Waste Management North is the single waste hauler for most residents in Lincolnshire.** If you have questions or problems, the waste hauler can be reached at 800-796-9696 or 630-724-8400. However, if you are a member of a Homeowners' Association, your home is not necessarily covered by Waste Management North. Check with your Homeowners' Association for more information.
- **If you have any old major appliances you wish to discard, call Environmental Field Service at 800-480-4337.** This service will collect these appliances for a fee that is much lower than what Waste Management North would charge.
