Coyote Update

As a follow up to the information placed in the January NewsLetter, and in an effort to keep the Village residents informed, the Village has conducted a coyote trapping effort with some success. The Village Board directed staff to focus on the aggressive animals displaying unnaturally bold behavior.



Four animals were taken in the Village. Necropsy reports were provided to Village staff. Two of the animals were healthy, one of which had dog food in its stomach. The other two were extremely sick with fatal diseases. Interestingly, one of the sick animals had a very healthy appearance and no indication of this level of illness.

The urban coyote is here to stay. It is completely impractical to think this animal could be eliminated. We must learn to live in harmony with nature. A coyote sighting is nothing to be alarmed about. They are hunting for food. Their natural diet is rabbit and voles; however, as stated above, a coyote will eat just about anything.

WHAT YOU AS RESIDENTS CAN DO

Never leave small children unattended; Never attempt to befriend any wildlife; supervise all pets closely, keep them under your control; If your pet must be left alone outside, make sure it is in a secured area; If confronted by a coyote you should yell, stamp your feet and look big by waving your arms. Your children especially need to know this.

Make sure garbage is secured, compost is covered, fallen fruit is picked up, no pet food is left outside, bird feeders are not overflowing with seed, and do not feed the deer or other animals.

Need a Vehicle Sticker?

The elimination of the requirement to purchase vehicle stickers in Lincolnshire was met with delight by Village residents. However, some had concerns that when visiting communities that require vehicle stickers, that community might "write a ticket first, and ask questions later" for those vehicles not having a sticker. Recent Village Board Action

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of December 11th, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved an Ordinance Levying Taxes for Corporate Purposes of the Village of Lincolnshire, Lake County, Illinois for the Fiscal Year Beginning the first day of January, 2007 and ending December 31, 2007.
- Approved an Ordinance Abating Taxes for Corporate Purposes (Debt Service) of the Village of Lincolnshire, Lake County, Illinois for the Fiscal Year Beginning the first day of January, 2007 and Ending December 31, 2007.
- Approved an Ordinance Abating and Reducing Certain Taxes Heretofore Levied to Pay Debt Service on SSA Bonds of the Village of Lincolnshire, Lake County, Illinois for Sedgebrook Special Service Area Number 1 Special Tax Bonds.

Consolidated Election April 17, 2007

Interested in Running for Office?

Petition packets are available at the Village Hall, as well as the Lake County Clerk's Office, for candidates planning to run for Mayor, Trustee, or Village Clerk in the Consolidated Election on April 17, 2007. Petitions can be circulated at this time.

The Mayor's seat, four Trustees' seats and the Village Clerk's seat will be decided in this election. (Three Trustee seats are four-year terms and one is a two-year term.) Nomination papers for new political parties, independents and nonpartisan candidates must be filed at the Village Hall between January 29, 2007 and February 5, 2007. Petitions should have a minimum of 57 signatures and a maximum of 107.

Residents should know that petitions should be signed by registered voters only, and you do not necessarily have to be "for" the candidate to sign his/her petition. By signing it you are recognizing the candidate's right to run for office.

Since the filing of petitions occurs too late to make the February NewsLetter, tune into cable channel 10 after February 5th to see who the candidates are.

Registered to Vote?

If not, come to the Village Hall. We have several staff members that can register you. You will need two forms of identification and one must be a picture ID. You also need to show proof that you live in Lake County. If you do not have an ID showing your current address, a utility bill can be used. Questions? Call 847-883-8600.



Candidate Signage

The Village Code regulates the size of political signs. The maximum size for political signs



is six square feet, which is the size of a standard 2 x 3 foot sign, and it cannot be any higher than four feet off the ground.

All political signs must be displayed no more than thirty-six days prior and removed within two days after an election. Since the election is on Tuesday, April 17th this year, no political signs should go up before Tuesday, March 13th, and they should be taken down by Thursday, April 19th. Since the wastehaulers come through the Village on Wednesday, April 18th, it's a good idea to take the signs out of your yard and put them at the curb at the same time you put your waste and recycleables.

Signs must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowner. Private property typically begins fifteen feet from the roadway. Rights-of-way along roads such as Riverwoods Road, Route 22, and Milwaukee Avenue are not private property. Any signage along these roadways must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowners. **Any signage not meeting this criteria will be removed by the Village staff.**

50th Anniversary "Special Event License Plates"

Want to spread the word about Lincolnshire's 50th Anniversary? You can purchase *Special Event License Plates* through the Village that can be mounted on your car over your existing license plates between June 7th and August 5th. Vehicles eligible to display these special plates are passenger cars, B-trucks, motorcycles and some recreational vehicles. The vehicle must be registered in Illinois, and the owner must keep the regular license plate and registration ID in the vehicle at all times.

Carbon Monoxide Alarm Detectors

******Required By State Law******

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless gas produced during incomplete combustion of fuels, (e.g. natural gas, LP gas, kerosene, oil, wood and charcoal). This gas is lethal to humans if it builds up in the home.

The National Safety Council reports that between 200 and 300 people die in the United States from carbon monoxide poisoning each year. Additionally, according to a report in the Chicago Sun-Times recently, the Illinois Poison Center has received well over 1,000 calls regarding CO poisoning this year, an increase of 37 percent over last year.

As a result, the Illinois State Legislature recently passed Public Act 094-0741, the "Carbon Monoxide Alarm Detector Act". This act went into effect on January 1, 2007.

The act requires that homeowner/property owners be responsible for installing at least one carbon monoxide detector in their homes, with few exceptions, at locations within fifteen (15') feet of each room used for sleeping purposes. The testing and maintenance instructions for these detectors must also be kept on-site. In rental units, it is the responsibility of the tenant to test and maintain the detectors. The act also states that upon second notification that your property is not in compliance with this act, the owner/tenant will be subject to a Class B misdemeanor, punishable by up to six months in jail and a \$1,500 fine.

"Accidental carbon monoxide deaths are very preventable simply by having a detector in your home", said Illinois State Fire Marshal Dave Foreman. "This law will help save many lives."

Did You Know?

The Village of Lincolnshire has specific Codes pertaining to the storage of yard waste and other outside materials. These Codes have been established in order to maintain a neat and orderly appearance of our neighborhoods.

- It is unlawful for any person to dump or deposit any grass, leaves, branches or parts of trees in any public way within the Village except during the Fall, when leaves may be placed in the street during your specified pick-up week for collection by Village Staff.
- It is unlawful for any person to store or deposit any material of any kind on any property in the Village, except when the storing is incidental to residential use (lawn chairs, grills, etc.)
- Building materials are not allowed to be stored at a site unless a Building Permit has been issued and the building materials are to be used in conjunction with the permit.

The Village asks that you please store any lawn maintenance equipment, or items not typical to incidental use, in your garage or areas not visible to the public or adjacent properties. Residents can also consider installing a shed, but a Building Permit must first be obtained and approved by the Village before installation takes place.

One Hundred Year Flood Defined

“Does a 100-year flood occur once every 100-years?” is a question that we hear frequently when people discuss floodplains. By definition, a 100-year flood, also known as the “base flood,” is a flood that has a one percent (1%) chance of occurring in any given year (for other probabilities, see the table). The area susceptible to flooding during the base flood is called the Special Flood Hazard Area, or floodplain. The elevation of the water for a flood event of a given probability is determined by engineers by studying rainfall intensities, stream and river cross-sections, and topography.

Studies suggest that during the 30-year life of a typical mortgage, a structure located within the 100-year floodplain has a 26 percent (26%) chance of experiencing flooding but a four percent (4%) chance of experiencing a fire. This statistic is the reason why flood insurance coverage is mandatory for structures whose mortgage is backed by the federal government. Remember, your general homeowners insurance policy **DOES NOT** cover losses from floods. Therefore, even if you do not live in the Special Flood Hazard Area, you should consider purchasing flood insurance.
