



# Recent Village Board Action

## At its Regular Village Board Meeting of April 23rd, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved a proposed new house addition and building materials for a residence, as regulated by the Whytegate (Unit One) Subdivision Covenants, for the property located at 303 Carlisle Lane.
- Approved an Ordinance amending Title 1-8D and 5-3 of the Village Code to clarify petitioner responsibility for the reimbursement of professional fees for building permits.
- Approved the lowest responsible bid in an amount not to exceed \$14,453.00 from Atlas Companies of Schiller Park, IL, for a utility cart.
- Approved an Ordinance amending Title 8-1 regarding Park Rules.
- Approved an application for a Federal Service Mark for the Village of Lincolnshire Logo.
- Approved the Village's insurance package for 2007-08.

## At its Regular Village Board Meeting of May 14th, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved a proposed revision to exterior signage for DSW Shoes at Lincolnshire Commons.
- Approved an Ordinance amending Title 6-11-3 (B), Off-Street Parking, and Section 6-2-2, Zoning Definitions, of the Village Code to revise the required number of parking spaces for restaurant uses, based upon their level of service.
- Approved the waiving of sealed bids and the purchase of 22 Hadco luminaries from Brook Electric, Lincolnshire, IL, in an amount not to exceed \$13,810.50, for the Riverwoods Road Street Light/Sign Pole Replacement.
- Approved an Ordinance authorizing the Execution of an Economic Incentive Agreement.
- Approved the dedication of right-of-way to the Illinois Department of Transportation.
- Approved the lowest responsible bid from Curran Contracting Company, Lake Bluff, IL, in an amount not to exceed \$1,193,023.20 for the Olde Half Day Road Realignment/Traffic Signal.

# Did You Know?

The Village of Lincolnshire requires residents to submit a completed Building Permit Application for review by Village Staff before installing a detached accessory storage structure such as a shed on your property. The Village has specific requirements that must be met in order for the storage structure to be compliant with Village Building Codes. These requirements are as follows:

- The maximum floor area of the structure cannot exceed 100 square feet.
- The structure must be within 6" of your home, or attached to a deck or patio, or within 6" of a deck or patio.
- The structure must be placed on a hard surface that includes, but is not limited to a concrete pad, cement blocks or similar materials.
- The structure shall be screened by plant material to provide year round visual relief to both the public and adjacent properties.
- The structure shall not exceed a height of 10' from the established grade.
- The structure shall have the same roof material as the principal structure.
- The following materials are prohibited, unless they are the primary material on the primary structure: plastic, corrugated metal, fiberglass and dryvit/stucco.

The following materials are typical household chemical wastes that are usually included in a one day HCW drop-off event. To help you determine if something is a household chemical waste, look for the words "danger," "toxic," "flammable," "corrosive," and/or "reactive" somewhere on the product's packaging.

Materials **ACCEPTED** at HCW collections: oil-based paint, solvents, old prescriptions, motor oil, household cleaners, household batteries (alkaline and rechargeable), antifreeze, garden/lawn chemicals, pool chemicals, asbestos, old gasoline, fungicides, insecticides, pesticides, metal polishes, paint remover, driveway sealer, drain cleaner, aerosol products, hobby chemicals, mercury (including thermometers and thermostats).

Latex paint will **NOT** be accepted at any of the Agency's HCW events. Other materials not accepted include business wastes, farm chemicals, propane tanks, lead-acid batteries, explosives, medical wastes, fire extinguishers, and smoke detectors.

# Clean Your Water...

Because we all live in a watershed, we all impact water runoff from rain. We need to be aware that our impact can negatively affect the quality of our streams and rivers. The Village has enacted regulations prohibiting the introduction of pollutants or chemicals into the storm sewers as these pipes lead to open waterways. Residents can take steps to keep contaminated water on their property. This can be done by directing water runoff from our roofs, sump pumps and driveways into rain barrels, rain gardens, open vegetated swales or other features where that water can be used in a constructive way or absorbed by plants. Residents should consider planting vegetation on their property that are native to our area. These plants require less watering and absorb more water than many non-native plants.

# Water Meter Reading

The Village of Lincolnshire's Water Department will be reading inside water meters for single family homes located **East of the Des Plaines River, West of**



**Riverwoods Road and South of Half Day Road.** Inspections will be performed from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, beginning July 1st over a period of two months. Inside meter readings are taken every third year to verify that the inside meter matches the outside meter readings. To eliminate the need to enter each house quarterly, the outside meter is read to determine the owner's water usage. This program assures you the accuracy of the meter readings.

This program also includes a mandated inspection of your plumbing system and sump pumps. The average time required per property is about ten minutes.

# Flood Insurance Information

The Village of Lincolnshire has been a member of the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System since 1992. The CRS program is a voluntary auditing program that is used to assure our residents that the Village meets or exceeds the requirements of the NFIP. The CRS measures the Village's activities relating to the floodplain and rewards communities which have strong floodplain ordinances and which take a proactive stance against flooding. The CRS assigns credits to a variety of activities taken to ensure appropriate floodplain management measures are implemented. The credits are totaled and put into classifications with 'Class 10' being the lowest classification and 'Class 1' being the highest. The Village first achieved a Class 9 rating upon initiation. Since 2005, the Village has been a Class 5 community.

Residents who purchase flood insurance for structures located in the floodplain are currently eligible to receive a 25 percent discount on their flood insurance premiums under the Village's Class 5 rating. Structures located outside of the floodplain receive a 10 percent discount on premiums. Preferred Risk Policies do not receive discounts. As of September 2004, there were 114 NFIP policies in the Village with a total annual premium of \$75,686. The total coverage is for \$29,740,100.

# Your Pets

## Licenses

Dogs and cats no longer have to be registered in the Village. **Dogs are still required to be vaccinated for rabies annually and wear the rabies tag issued by the Lake County Health Department.** Dog and cat owners should make sure their pets are wearing some type of identification tag in the event they are picked up by the Police Department. This will ensure your animal's speedy and safe return.

## Number of Pets

The Lincolnshire Village Code specifies that residents may have up to three (3) dogs or three (3) cats, or a combination of three dogs or cats at a residence in the Village. Any more than three (3) dogs or cats is a violation and could result in a ticket being issued.

## Animal Litter

The Police Department is receiving more complaints of animal owners allowing their pets to defecate on property other than their own, and not picking up the waste. The problem is evident along the Village's bike paths. **This is a violation of the Village Code and could result in a \$50.00 ticket.** Be respectful and responsible and pick up after your pet wherever you are, and please help keep our Village attractive.

## Parks

As a reminder, dogs are not allowed in any of the Village's parks at any time.

## Pets on a Leash

While off your property, the Village Code requires your pet to be under your direct control at all times. While some pets are very well trained, most require being on a leash. Also, even when on your property, your dog may become startled or excited when a walker or jogger goes by, and they could dart at or charge the person. Please keep your pet under your control at all times when outdoors.

# Mosquito Abatement



The Mayor and Board of Trustees want every resident to be informed of the effort the Village is putting forth regarding the Mosquito Abatement Program and the West Nile Virus. The Village has teamed up with Clarke Environmental Mosquito Control to administer our integrated program.

West Nile Virus is a mosquito-borne disease. Symptoms of the disease initially are similar to the flu. The majority of individuals infected with the disease will never know it. The symptoms will be so mild they will go undetected. In severe cases, the disease may cause encephalitis, paralysis, coma or death. Individuals with compromised immune systems and senior citizens are at the greatest risk.

The Village of Lincolnshire has contracted with Clarke Environmental Mosquito Control for a sophisticated abatement program. This integrated approach includes mosquito traps for monitoring numbers of insects, prevention of larval mosquito development in stormwater catch basins, and insect-eating fish used in detention basins.

When the mosquito count elevates, the Village will provide adult mosquito control. This is the most effective method for controlling mosquitoes and the West Nile Virus once the insect matures. Even with this comprehensive program in place, the cooperation of each Lincolnshire resident is needed.

Protect yourself during daylight hours, especially at sunrise and just before and after sunset:

- Wear light colored, long-sleeved tops and long pants.
- Consider applying insect repellent that contains DEET with 14% to 25% Diethylmeta-toluamide to exposed skin (Off® or Cutter® are common brands).

Prevent mosquito breeding around your home:

- Dispose of all standing water in buckets, cans or any water-holding container outdoors.
- At least once a week empty water from bird baths and plant-pot drip trays.
- Keep roof gutters clean and free of debris.

Having an outdoor party?

- Use a fogger or spray insecticide on foliage near and around the party site just prior to the arrival of guests.
- Have insect repellent for guests in a prominent place.

## West Nile Virus Hotline

The Lake County Health Department has reactivated its West Nile Virus Hotline. The WNV hotline, 847-337-8300, provides information about West Nile Virus and allows residents to report dead bird sightings (crows and blue jays), which can indicate the virus is in the region, as well as neglected pools and other conditions conducive to mosquito breeding.

The Clark Mosquito Hotline, 800-942-2555, has also been activated to allow residents to report standing water or to be placed on its night spraying Prior Notification list.

Please report dead bird sightings to the Lake County Health Department's WNV Hotline. This dead bird information is utilized by Clarke in coordination with the Lake County Health Department surveillance program.

# Good Humor Truck & Safety

With the arrival of summer comes the Good Humor truck traveling through the Village. With this in mind, parents should discuss certain safety tips with their children:



1. Children should never go to the ice cream truck without their parents' knowledge.
2. Children should wait until the ice cream truck comes to their house and should not chase the truck to other streets.
3. Children should never step into the street. Wait up on the curb until the truck comes to a complete stop before approaching it.
4. Be extremely careful if it is necessary to cross the street to get to the truck. Look left, right and left again.
5. Never get inside the ice cream truck. The vendor can make the transaction from the truck window.
6. Parents should accompany their children whenever possible, but at a minimum, they should keep an eye on the children at all times.

The ice cream vender is required to hold a license from the Village which will contain his name, company name and his photograph. If the vendor does not have a license, please notify the Police Department.

# Forester's Corner

## Emerald Ash Borer Reconnaissance Initiative



Emerald Ash Borer (EAB), is an exotic beetle that was discovered in southeastern Michigan during the summer of 2002. The larvae of this small insect feed on the inner bark of ash trees, killing the tree by disrupting its ability to transport water and nutrients. The Emerald Ash Borer probably arrived in the United States on solid wood packing material carried in cargo ships or airplanes originating in its native Asia. Currently EAB has killed more than 20 million ash trees and has become established in Michigan, Ontario, Ohio, Indiana, and northern Illinois.

The USDA, as well as State Agencies and Universities, are hard at work researching potential methods of detecting, containing, and controlling this destructive pest. However, size and quickness of the EAB adult (a fi inch long metallic green beetle) make it difficult to capture during its flight season (May to August). Furthermore, presence of the EAB larva can only be confirmed by removing significant portions of bark from the tree.

Despite these obstacles to detecting Emerald Ash Borer, it is in the Village's best interest to be aware of an EAB infestation as soon as possible. For this reason the Village Forester has developed an EAB Reconnaissance Initiative, utilizing Lincolnshire's existing Tree Preservation Code, to survey for the pest.

As the Village's residents should already be aware, Lincolnshire's Tree Preservation Code requires residents to obtain a Tree Removal Permit before removing any tree measuring six (6) inches or greater in diameter (even dead trees). **In order to make sure that no EAB infested trees slip by undetected, Tree Removal Permits issued for any ash tree will include the added requirement that a (3 ft. long x 6" to 8" diameter) section of the tree be left on the property for the Village Forester to inspect.**

Since a significant amount of Ash trees are permitted for removal each year, this new EAB Reconnaissance Initiative will accomplish the Village's goal of detecting the presence of Emerald Ash Borer quickly and in a manner that does not cause the undue destruction of healthy trees.

## Jewels of Lincolnshire - Our Parks!

**Olde Mill Park** - Olde Mill Park is located at the corner of Fallstone and Old Mill Road. This small park is filled with opportunities! There is a small picnic area at the front of the park. Walk back into the park and you will see a bocce ball court, playground, baseball field, soccer field, and volleyball court. On the upper north end of the park, it looks like it is a residential area but it is park land, and open play area. There is a drinking fountain and seating for those who wish to just sit and relax.

Coming soon to this park is a frisbee golf course featuring several holes and continuation of the east-west path. Currently the path ends at the western end of the park. Soon it will cross the southeast end of the park and connect the existing east and west paths.

**Bicentennial Park** - This small park is located off of Fox Trail. There is a new playground, drinking fountain, picnic area, seating and an open play area. It is situated behind homes and is very secluded. A brick paver path was recently installed that winds its way through the park and out to each of the three entrances. This is a great place to sit and enjoy the beautiful summer weather.

# Spring Lake Beach Rules



If you plan to use Spring Lake Beach, you should make yourself aware of the beach's rules:

- All beach users are responsible to review beach rules as posted at the beach.
- If no lifeguard is on duty, swimmers swim at their own risk.
- If present, lifeguards are responsible for enforcing safety rules and responding to emergencies. Parents or guardians should supervise their children.
- Children ages 10 and under must be accompanied and supervised by an adult (18 or older).
- No one should swim alone.
- Entrance to the water shall only be from the beach.
- Patrons are encouraged to protect themselves from sun exposure.
- All children who are not toilet-trained shall wear tight fitting rubber or plastic pants.
- Children in flotation devices must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- Persons under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a responsible person 16 years of age or older unless a lifeguard is present.
- All persons in the beach area, when a lifeguard is on duty, are required to pay a fee between the hours of 10:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
- Appropriate beach attire is required at all times in the beach area.
- Swimmers of questionable skill are required to take and pass a swim test prior to being allowed on the water feature or in deep water.
- Season Tags or Daily Wristbands must be clearly visible to the lifeguard.
- The lake water is not suitable for drinking. Avoid swallowing lake water.
- Admission to the beach may be refused to all persons having any contagious disease, infectious conditions such as colds, fever, ringworm, foot infections, skin lesions, carbuncles, boils, diarrhea, vomiting, inflamed eyes, ear discharges, or any other condition which has the appearance of being infectious. Persons with excessive sunburn, abrasions, which have not healed, or bandages of any kind may also be refused admittance. A person under the influence of alcohol or exhibiting erratic behavior shall not be permitted in the beach area.
- Littering is prohibited. In addition, no alcohol, food, gum or tobacco is allowed on the beach or in the water.
- Glass containers are prohibited throughout the beach area.
- Personal conduct within the beach must be such that safety is not jeopardized.
- Diving is not permitted.
- Swimming is prohibited after sunset or before sunrise, or when lightning is present, including a 30 minute period after the last lightning is observed.
- No pets are permitted in the park or beach area.
- Feeding of wildlife or other actions that encourage their presence is prohibited and are subject to a fine under the Village Code.
- Groups of 15 to 30 persons must purchase a beach permit. Groups larger than 30 are prohibited.

***Here are some water safety tips to help make your summer-time swim with your children a pleasant and safe one.***

- Never leave your children alone or near the water, even for a moment.
- Do not let your child use air-filled "swimming aids" because they are not a substitute for approved life preservers and vests.
- It's a good idea to learn CPR if you plan on watching small children around water. Always stay within an arm's length reach of a child.
- Finally, teaching your child how to swim does not mean your child is safe in the water without you!
