Bulk Regulations

This past fall the Village's Zoning Board undertook the arduous task of reviewing and revising the zoning regulations in an effort to provide consistency throughout the Village's single-family residential districts. You may recall, the Village Board previously approved new bulk regulations (building height, setbacks and other lot restrictions) for single-family residential districts in November 2004. This was done in light of increased teardown activity and concern about the negative effect that rebuilt homes were having on the residential neighborhoods. It was the decision of the Village Board that this matter be revisited last fall to discuss additional regulatory techniques to appropriately control the building "envelope" on a site.

As part of this recent review of the regulations, the Zoning Board held a series of "workshops" to discuss the information provided by Staff and narrow the scope of the necessary changes to the Village Code, prior to conducting the required public hearings. After thorough consideration and recommendation by the Zoning Board, the Village Board approved revisions to the zoning regulations on January 22nd with regard to yard requirements in the R2A District, the establishment of a maximum impervious surface area and the implementation of a Building Setback Plane within all the single-family residential districts. Recent Village Board Action

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of January 22nd, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved an Ordinance Granting a variance to Title 12-14-3 (C) of the Downtown Development District's Sign Control regulations to permit the installation of a wall sign which exceeds the permitted maximum size requirement for signs located within the Downtown Development District for the Infinity Restaurant located at 185 Milwaukee Avenue.
- Approved an Ordinance amending Title 6-2, Definitions, 6-5A, R1, R2 and R3 Single-Family Residence Districts, and 6-5B, R2A Single-Family Residence District, in order to address the bulk regulations for single-family lots with regard to Yard Requirements, Floor Area Ratio, Impervious Surface Area and Building Side Setback Planes. - Approved an Intergovernmental Agreement between Vernon Township and the Village of Lincolnshire for snow and ice control.
- Approved a request for use of Village streets for a Spring, 5K race sponsored by the Vernon Area Public Library.
- Approved the purchase of three replacement police squads through the State of Illinois Joint Purchasing Program in an amount not to exceed \$59,000.

Spring Cleanup, Saturday, April 21st

Start preparing now for the Annual Spring Cleanup. It will be held on Saturday, April 21st.

Residents may put out household goods with the exception of "white goods" (appliances), household chemical waste and landscape waste. Items such as carpet or lumber must be bundled in lengths not more than 4 feet long and two feet in diameter. All items must be of such a size that one person can lift them.

All goods must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the morning of the pickup. Residents may begin placing items at the curb after 7:00 p.m. the night before.

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of February 12th, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved building elevation modifications to an approved restaurant for an enclosed patio, for Fleming's Steakhouse & Wine Bar located at 960 Milwaukee Avenue within the Lincolnshire Commons lifestyle center.
- Approved a request to waive building permit fees totaling approximately \$185.00 for costs associated with the proposed construction of a covered entrance on the south side of the existing Riverside Foundation building.
- Approved revisions to the Village of Lincolnshire Disaster Preparedness Plan.
- Approved an Ordinance authorizing the sale, by bids, of a triangular parcel at the northeast corner of the Village's recently-acquired outlot at the Lincolnshire Forest subdivision. This outlot is at the northeast corner of Half Day Road and Elm Road, is 1.7 acres in size, and has no adjacent road access. The property is usable only as access within the Lincolnshire Forest Subdivision.

Flood Insurance

The Des Plaines River and the West Branch of the North Fork of the Chicago River are beautiful assets that our residents



enjoy. However, these bodies of water can unleash a destructive force, capable of destroying homes and their contents. All areas are susceptible to flooding to varying degrees. In fact, 25% of all flood claims occur in the low-to-moderate risk areas. Flooding can be caused by heavy rains, melting snow, by inadequate drainage systems, failed protective devices such as levees and dams, as well as by tropical storms and hurricanes.

Residents can protect their homes against flooding in many ways. One option is to purchase low-cost flood insurance available through the National Flood Insurance Program.

Regular insurance policies do not cover damage due to floods since they are known hazards. If your house is located in a regulated floodplain (Special Flood Hazard Area), and is financed through a lending institution that is federally regulated or federally insured, then you **must** purchase flood insurance. Insurance may be purchased through your personal insurance agent or company. You can protect your home up to \$250,000 for the structure and \$100,000 for its contents.

If you do not live in a regulated floodplain, you still qualify for a Preferred Risk Policy, which is a special flood insurance coverage. This type of policy allows you to obtain coverage up to \$250,000 for the structure and \$60,000 for the contents at significantly reduced rates.

There is a 30-day waiting period before coverage goes into effect. Do not wait until the next flood to purchase your insurance.

Snow Plow Damage

Village crews are careful and try to avoid damaging property as they plow the snow, but because the snow can sometimes obscure the line between the curb and the lawn, accidents do happen. If you discover damage to your lawn or mailbox after the snow plows have passed, call Wendy Moderhack, at 847-883-8600 during normal business hours. The Public Works Department will determine if the Village is responsible and will make repairs as soon as possible. However, landscape restoration cannot be done until the Spring.



Sanitary Sewer Service Lines

Spring cleaning is just around the corner. To reduce the chance of a sanitary sewer backup, you may wish to have your service line from your house to the main line cleaned or inspected. Tree roots can block the flow through these lines by entering through cracks in joints of the pipes. Commercial contractors who perform this service are listed in the phone book under "Sewer Cleaners and Repairers".

Open Gym Ends March 18th

The Village offers an Open Gym Program on Sundays, between October 2nd and March 19th, at Half Day School from 12:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. There are only a few weeks left before it ends! There are two gyms available. Children under 12 years old must be accompanied by an adult who must remain on the premises. Either basketball or volleyball may be played. A season release is required before anyone is allowed to participate, and the weekly fee is \$3.00. Releases are available at both the Village Hall and during Open Gym. Parents should not drop off children at Half Day School without being sure that releases have been signed.

Forester's Corner

Keeping an Eye Out for Hazardous Trees



Residents of Lincolnshire have always enjoyed the numerous benefits of living amongst the trees. However, the sheer size and weight of these great plants yields the potential for trees and tree parts to be damaging or even deadly should they break and fall. Fortunately, with a little bit of effort, and some advice from a qualified tree care professional, the risks sometimes associated with trees can be greatly reduced.

As a property owner, it is a good idea to get well acquainted with trees on your property. Take some time to inspect each of your trees, especially the trees in close proximity to your home. Look for potential defects such as cracks, large cavities, poor or lopsided branching structure, fungal growth at or near the base of the tree, damaged root systems, and dead or leaning trees. Then determine if any of the potentially defective trees are close enough to your house to cause damage if they were to fall. Remember a tree can only be a hazard if it has a target to fall on.

If you think you have a hazardous tree on your property, contact your tree care provider or the Village Forester for a professional opinion and advice on how to deal with the subject tree. Keep in mind that many tree defects have potential to be corrected, so not all hazardous trees are a lost cause.

Since trees can sometimes fail without warning, it is a good idea to inspect your trees regularly, especially after significant wind or ice storms. Change Your Clocks

On August 8, 2005, President Bush signed the Energy Policy Act of 2005.

This Act changed the time change dates for Daylight Saving Time in the United States.

Beginning in 2007, DST will begin on the second Sunday in March and end the first Sunday in November. The Secretary of Energy will report the impact of this change to Congress. Congress retains the right to resume the 2005 Daylight Saving Time schedule once the Department of Energy study is complete.

Daylight Saving Time will begin on Sunday morning, March 11th, at 2:00 a.m.

When you set your clock ahead, take the time to change the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. This simple act could save your life and the lives of your family.



Coyote Update

At the January 8th Committee of the Whole meeting, the Board directed staff to continue using the trapper in order to target two specific coyotes which had repeatedly been seen in the area of Nottingham/WoodCreek Courts and Northampton/Daniel Wright/Brampton. The trapper was able to successfully capture the alpha male in the Nottingham area as well as the elusive female in the Daniel Wright area. Three additional animals were destroyed bringing Lincolnshire's total to nine coyotes. Necropsy reports indicated diseased animals as well as injected dog food. The trapper recommended that we stop the trapping efforts at this time. He feels the Village was successful in removing the two remaining coyotes which were acting boldly and overly aggressive. Staff will continue to monitor the situation.



What You As Residents Can Do

Never leave small children unattended; never attempt to befriend any wildlife; supervise all pets closely, keep them under your control. If your pet must be left alone outside, make sure it is in a secured area. If confronted by a coyote you should yell, stamp your feet and look big by waving your arms. Your children especially need to know this.

Make sure garbage is secured, compost is covered, fallen fruit is picked up, no pet food is left outside, bird feeders are not overflowing with seed, and do not feed the deer or other animals.

Buy A Rain Barrel!

A rain barrel connected to your downspout - also known as a rain bank - is a great way to keep stormwater out of the system and to reduce your water bill! Because you are collecting right off the roof, it has few contaminants and is perfect for watering the garden.

Diverting water from your downspout into rainwater "catchment systems" has several advantages:

- Reduces the volume of water flowing to the storm sewer system
- Lowers the percentage of roof top rainfall as a component of urban runoff
- Backup source of water during times of drought or between rain showers
- Helps to keep our creeks and rivers clean
- Naturally softened water - great for delicate houseplants, auto cleaning and window washing
- Saves money by lowering your water bill
- Reduces the need for additional tax dollars earmarked for sewer expansion
- Chlorine-free water helps maintain a healthy biotic community in the soil
- Educational tool for teaching residents about water conservation

Now you can Vote Early

Early Voting has arrived! Early voting will be offered to any eligible voter, without reason (i.e. not required to be absent, physically disabled, etc.).

Early Voting in the Consolidated Election of April 17th begins on Monday, March 26th, and runs through Thursday, April 12th. Voters are required to present a valid Illinois driver's license, an Illinois identification card issued by the Secretary of State, or any other government-issued identification document containing their photograph, name and address.

Campaign Signage

The Village Code regulates the size of political signs. The maximum size for political signs is six square feet, which is the size of a standard 2 x 3 foot sign, and it cannot be any higher than four feet off the ground.



All political signs must be displayed no more than thirty-six days prior to and removed within two days after an election. Since the election is on Tuesday, April 17th, this year, no political signs should go up before Monday, March 12th, and they should be taken down by Thursday, April 19th. Since the wastehaulers come through the Village on Wednesday, April 18th, it's a good idea to take the signs out of your yard and put them at the curb at the same time you put your waste and recycleables there.

Signs must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowner. Private property typically begins fifteen feet from the roadway. Rights-of-way along roads such as Riverwoods Road, Route 22, and Milwaukee Avenue are not private property. Any signage along these roadways must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowners. Any signage not meeting this criteria will be removed by the Village staff.

Employee of the Year!



The selection of Employee of the Year for 2006 was no easier than in the past years that we have designated this honor. The recipient named as this year's Employee of the Year is Police Investigator John-Erik Anderson.

John-Erik began his career with Lincolnshire as a Police Officer in August 1996. He was trained as a D.A.R.E. officer and instructed a D.A.R.E. class which graduated in 1998. John-Erik has also been assigned as the Liaison Officer at Stevenson High School. In that capacity he was very highly respected and appreciated by staff and students. In 2002 John-Erik was appointed as a Criminal Investigator, a position he holds to this day. While in this position, John-Erik has worked several major investigations resulting in felony arrests. The most recent substantial case John-Erik worked involved the identity theft case involving almost 100 current or past major league baseball players. Through his efforts, a subject was arrested and charged with over 20 felony counts. John-Erik recently applied for and was accepted on the Lake County Major Crimes Task Force, an elite group of Investigators from Lake County. While on the task force he was called out as an Investigator to the three recent homicides in Lake County, one occurring in Lindenhurst where the Burger King Manager was killed, another in Libertyville where the youth from Deerfield was shot killed, and the most recent being the double-homicide in Buffalo Grove.

John Erik is an excellent representative of the Village of Lincolnshire and truly deserves to be proclaimed Employee of the Year-2006.
