## **S**ummer Water Restrictions

Outside water usage will be restricted in the Village between May 15th through September 15th. If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8), then you may use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), you may use outside water on calendar days which are odd.

Despite the vast pool of water to our east known as Lake Michigan, there is not an unlimited supply of water in this area. Under an international treaty, communities bordering Lake Michigan are restricted in the amount of water that can be withdrawn from the lake. As a result, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Office of Water Resources, requires communities to take measures to conserve water. Outside water use restrictions are implemented by communities as one such conservation. In Lincolnshire, residents may use potable water outside-of-buildings, including water used for sprinkling of lawns and gardens or washing cars, in accordance with this odd/even schedule.

## **S**wearing-in of Officials May 14th

Although the Consolidated Election took place on April 17th, Village Officials will not be sworn in until Monday, May 14th, to give the County time to check the provisional ballots. If a person goes to vote and their name is not active in the Lake County system, or if he/she registered to vote with the Department of Motor Vehicles and that information was not transferred to the County, he/she is allowed to vote provisionally, and the County then has 14 days to determine the ballot's accuracy. Because of this added process, there is a delay between the date of the election, and when the County can declare the winners. # Village to Offer Curb and Gutter Replacement Program



Did you know that the Village typically owns the curbs and gutters within the public right-of-way? The curbs and gutters convey storm water, provide a physical barrier between the roadway and parkway, and serve as a de-facto delineation of the property owners and Village's maintenance responsibilities.

The Village replaces curbs on an annual basis as a result of problems with the proper function of the curb. Due to the large volume of curb and gutter replacement, the Village typically receives a quantity discount. The Village would like to allow residents who want to replace curb and gutter along the frontage of their property, due to aesthetic reasons, an opportunity to do so. This would be done at the homeowner's expense, yet managed through the Village.

The Public Works Department will compile a list of the curb replacement locations and, as part of the annual Road Resurfacing Program Project, may include these areas. Any requests for curb replacement that are received after the project is bid will be done either in the late Fall or in conjunction with the following year's Road Resurfacing Project depending on the contractor's availability.

# Spring Lake Beach Opens

Spring Lake Beach will be open for swimming the weekends of Saturday, May 26th and June 3rd. The regular season will begin on June 4th, daily until August 19th. The beach will again be open the weekends of August 25th and September 3rd. Lifeguards are on duty daily from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Swimming is allowed from sunrise to sunset, from the Saturday before Memorial Day to the 30th of September. However, when no lifeguards are on duty, and you want to swim, it will be at your own risk. When lifeguards are off duty, swimmers age 16 and under must be accompanied by an adult. When there is a rain event, it is recommended that you wait to swim in the lake for 24 to 48 hours because of the possibility of bacteria in the water. ## Jewels of Lincolnshire - Our Parks!

In an effort to encourage residents to visit and use all of the parks in Lincolnshire, the Park Board has requested staff to highlight Village parks in the NewsLetters over the summer months. One visit to these gems will bring you back again and again. We guarantee it!

### *Florsheim Nature Preserve, North Park and Old Mill Woods Additions*

The Village of Lincolnshire owns and maintains more than 110 acres of dedicated Illinois Nature Preserves. Illinois Nature Preserves are selected based on their rare native properties with significant natural features that warrant the highest level of protection by the State of Illinois.

In 1985, Harold and Sarabel Florsheim donated 40 acres of rare sedge meadow, oak/hickory forest and prairie to the Village of Lincolnshire. The Village applied for protection as an Illinois Nature Preserve and the site was dedicated in 1996. The site contains threatened and endangered native plants and has a floristic quality index of 82 (a very high rating for existing native flora). This area has been maintained for control of invasive plants species and managed to encourage continued biological diversity.



In 1999, the Village purchased 65 acres along the West Fork of the North Branch of the Chicago River to build ball fields. 37.5 acres were restored and set aside as open space because of the rare “flatwoods”, wetlands and significant oak and hickory woodland. The headwaters of the West Fork of the North Branch of the Chicago River is also located on the property. This property was dedicated as an Illinois Nature Preserve in 2000.

In 2005, 32.5 acres were added with the addition of Old Mill Woods. This site was donated and restored by Kenneth James Builders as part of their development agreement with the Village. Invasive woody plants were removed and native trees, shrubs and plants installed to improve diversity of the native flora and wildlife. The Old Mill Woods addition was dedicated as Illinois Nature Preserve in 2006.

Florsheim, North Park and Old Mill Woods Nature Preserves are open from dawn to dusk daily. No picnics, pets or bicycles are allowed. Pedestrian foot paths have been installed to provide public access throughout the entire Nature Preserves. Interpretive signs are located along the paths to highlight site specific natural functions, wildlife, plants, etc.

Access to the Nature Preserves can be made from Old Mill Road, the North Park parking lot and Farrington Drive.

### *Rivershire Park*

Along the east bank of the Des Plaines River, the Village has preserved and restored a 15 acre natural area and with School District #103, has created a Nature Center. Rivershire Park started as a degraded flood plain and is now a wonderful outdoor education site for hundreds of children and the public. The park contains a restored wet meadow, floodplain woodland, demonstration prairie, wetland and tributary to the Des Plaines River – Lincolnshire Creek.



Children come to the site daily to learn about native plants, water quality, functions of riverine communities, wildlife, life cycles and much more. Park visitors can walk pedestrian paths through the floodplain forest, wet meadow and prairie.

The Des Plaines River is part of the regional water trail system. There is a canoe launch at the park and, all are welcome to use the launch to access the Des Plaines River.

*Rivershire Park, Nature Center and launch are located at 45 Londonderry Lane. The park is open dawn to dusk daily. No pets or bicycles are allowed.*

## Annual Street Resurfacing Project

The 2007 edition of the Annual Street Resurfacing Project began in late April. The Village will be resurfacing Reliance Lane, Buckingham Place, Margate Drive, Regent Lane, and Kings Cross Drive (between Grenadier Court and Regent Lane).

Residents along these streets will receive construction updates to help keep them informed of the project's progress.

Peter Baker and Son Contractors will be constructing this project.

The project is estimated to cost \$351,400 and is paid through a combination of Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) funds and the Village's General Fund. For more information on this project, please contact the Department of Public Works at 847-883-8600.

Items **NOT** Accepted: Broken Glass, Air Conditioners, Dehumidifiers, Large Household Appliances, Batteries, Electric Fixtures, Fluorescent Light Bulbs, Compact Disks, Software Disks, Tapes, Liquid or Chemical Waste, and Packaging Materials.

# Olde Half Day Road Construction

In 2006, the Illinois Department of Transportation reconstructed Olde Half Day Road from Indian Creek Road to Route 22. This left a section of Olde Half Day Road between Indian Creek Road and Milwaukee Avenue in poor shape.

The Village of Lincolnshire will be reconstructing the remaining portion of Olde Half Day Road west of Milwaukee Avenue. As part of the project, Olde Half Day Road will be realigned to create a right angle with Milwaukee Avenue. The east approach of this intersection will become the main access to the Village's downtown development. A traffic signal is proposed to be constructed at this intersection.

Work is expected to start later this spring. Commonwealth Edison and other utilities have already begun work to relocate their facilities to accommodate the change in the road.

# Route 22 Construction

Work has resumed after a respite for the winter on the reconstruction of Route 22 from west of Milwaukee Avenue to IL-83.

The contractor now believes that all lanes of traffic will be open by June 30, 2007. Additional time may be required to complete the installation of landscaping materials, sidewalks, and other items behind the curb.

The following materials are typical household chemical wastes that are usually included in a one day HCW drop-off event. To help you determine if something is a household chemical waste, look for the words "danger," "toxic," "flammable," "corrosive," and/or "reactive" somewhere on the product's packaging.

Materials **ACCEPTED** at HCW collections: oil-based paint, solvents, old prescriptions, motor oil, household cleaners, household batteries (alkaline and rechargeable), antifreeze, garden/lawn chemicals, pool chemicals, asbestos, old gasoline, fungicides, insecticides, pesticides, metal polishes, paint remover, driveway sealer, drain cleaner, aerosol products, hobby chemicals, mercury (including thermometers and thermostats).

Latex paint will **NOT** be accepted at any of the Agency's HCW events. Other materials not accepted include business wastes, farm chemicals, propane tanks, lead-acid batteries, explosives, medical wastes, fire extinguishers, and smoke detectors.

## **2007 Building Safety Week Theme: “Building Smarter...for Disasters and Everyday Life”**

Safe and proper construction is rarely on your mind when you enter a home or building. Fortunately, the Village Staff considers building safety and fire prevention every day. To help raise your awareness, the Village of Lincolnshire is celebrating Building Safety Week from May 6th through 12th. During this time, we will be promoting the use, enforcement, and understanding of building safety and fire prevention codes to protect lives and property. “Building Smarter ...for Disasters and Everyday Life” is the theme of Building Safety Week 2007, which is part of a worldwide effort in the building industry.

The importance of regulating and enforcing building codes is often overlooked until a catastrophic tragedy occurs. By inspecting buildings during and after construction, we help to ensure that buildings in the community are safe places in which to live, work, play, and learn.

Building code regulations in the Village help to ensure that buildings are as safe as possible. Codes address all aspects of construction including structural integrity, electrical, mechanical, and plumbing systems, energy efficiency, and property maintenance. Effective code enforcement requires the support of homeowners, architects, builders, engineers, and others in the construction industry.

Building Safety Week recognizes the important professionals who make sure the buildings in our community are safe. Public safety is the Building Division’s number one concern. In addition, building and fire officials are here to help everyone understand building safety issues. After all, in this age of “do-it-yourselfers”, it is extremely important for homeowners to work with the Village to make sure their residences fully comply with building safety codes.

During the week of May 6th, numerous “Building Safety Week” informational materials will be available at the Village Hall.
