## New Hiking and Recreational Paths Opening this Fall!

Several new segments of the Village's Hiking and Recreational Path system will open for use this fall. The Illinois Department of Transportation is constructing a path for the Village along both sides of Route 22 from the west Village limits to Barclay Boulevard. The Lake County Division of Transportation is constructing a path along the east side of Riverwoods Road from the south side of North Park to Everett Road and along the north side Everett Road into Lake Forest. Both agencies are constructing these Village funded paths as part of larger projects.



The Village will be constructing a path along the south side of Route 22 from the east side of the Wood Creek Courts property to Westminster Way. This path is scheduled to be completed by the end of the year, and is part of a section that is designed to extend to Berkshire Lane.

## Recent Village Board Action

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of August 13th, the Village Board of Trustees:

- Approved an Ordinance Rezoning an approximately 3.76 acre parcel from R1, Single-Family Residence zoning district to O/Ia, Office/Industrial zoning district, for the property at 535/545 Aptakisic Road .

# Fall Leaf Collection

The Public Works Department will begin its annual Leaf Collection Program on Monday, October 1st. Leaves must be placed in the street by noon on Wednesday of your specified pickup week to guarantee one final collection by Friday. Leaves placed in the street after that final collection is made will not be picked up until your next scheduled week of collection.

Leaf pickup is scheduled for Monday through Friday according to the following schedule:

## Residents West of Riverwoods Rd.

- Week of October 1
- Week of October 15
- Week of October 29
- Week of November 12
- Week of November 26

## Residents East of Riverwoods Rd

- Week of October 8
- Week of October 22
- Week of November 5
- Week of November 19

Please be careful not to mix foreign materials such as brush, garden waste, tree limbs, vines, lumber, etc. with your leaves. Materials such as these can cause equipment failure or injury to the operator or nearby citizens.

Due to the large volume of leaves, Public Works crews can only pick up leaves on one side of the Village each week. It is important to follow the schedule and not place leaves in the street for more than two to three days before your scheduled week of pickup. You may rake your leaves and place them on your grass near the curb as shown in the picture, then rake them into the street during your scheduled week. Leaves piled in the street during off-scheduled weeks become a fire hazard and can obstruct drivers' views of children at play. They also block the storm sewer inlets causing localized flooding. Please notify your landscaper of the Village's leaf pickup schedule if applicable.

# Halloween Safety Tips

Parents and children should observe the following safety tips on Halloween:



- Before eating treats, have your children bring them home for a parent's inspection.
- Costumes should be light in color, and children should carry flash lights pointed at the ground after dark. Strips of reflective tape on clothes are a good idea. Use makeup instead of masks that can obstruct vision.
- Children should be instructed to be careful when walking in the street or on the lawn near curbs.
- Be sure that your young children are accompanied by an adult or responsible teenager while they are trick or treating.
- Know which friends your children will be with and the route they will be taking.
- Children should not enter any home unless it is one of a relative or known friend.
- Children should be respectful and courteous to the property of others.
- Leave your porch light on so children will know they are welcome to visit your home. This will also discourage vandalism.
- Don't invite trick or treaters into your home unless you know them.
- Keep pets inside the house or garage on Halloween night.
- Children should not play in or near the piles of leaves near the street.

Grates clogged with leaves and trash can cause flooding. Please remove the debris away from the grate. ## Budget Process for Fiscal Year 2008

We have begun working on the new Budget that will guide the Village from January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. The following dates have been tentatively scheduled for resident input into this process:

### *Month of November*

The Mayor and Board of Trustees will establish special meetings during this month and will discuss a draft Budget. This draft, which will be available at the Village Hall and the Vernon Area Public Library for your review as of October 19th, will include personnel, programs, and capital expenditures.

### *Monday, November 12th*

The Budget will appear as an item for discussion on the Committee of the Whole Meeting agenda. This will be your opportunity to comment on the document and on discussions by Board members at the previous week's Budget meetings.

Final Budget consideration and approval is expected to occur on December 10th.

# It's Not What Your Tree can do for You, It's What You can do for Your Tree

From cleaning and replenishing the air we breathe to providing shelter from sun and wind, the trees of Lincolnshire add so much to the quality of life for Village residents. Yet, for all the benefits that they provide, trees ask very little in return. Here are a few things that your trees may ask of you and some ways that you can oblige them.



**I'm SO thirsty, can I have a sip of that?** Yup...trees like to drink. A Lot! Since summers around here (and sometimes Spring and Fall) can be pretty dry, your trees would be absolutely smitten with you if you give their root zones a good soaking once a week in the absence of rain. As a tree grows and matures, its extensive root system allows it to tolerate long periods without rain, but young and newly planted trees have relatively few roots, so they should be watered two to three times a week (especially when its hot!).

**I really need a new look, whose your stylist?** Some trees are happy to just let there crowns grow how ever and where ever they please. That's just fine for the scruffy and unpredictable trees living in the forest, but, in our yards, most of us would prefer a more civilized and nicely groomed tree that we can show off to our friends. Every four to five years do yourself (and your trees) a favor, have them pruned by an arborist. A well trained arborist will trim out problematic branches and shape the tree's crown, leaving it strong and reinvigorated. At the very least have somebody trim off the 'dead ends.'

**I love your wood floors, do you think I could get something like that?** Trees Love Mulch! It reminds them of living in the forest. It's also extremely functional. A nice ring of shredded mulch around the base of your trees will hold moisture, regulate root zone temperatures, and protect the sensitive tree trunk from lawn mowers and weed-wackers. Spread mulch loosely, 2- 4 inches is ideal, and make the mulch ring as big as you want. But BEWARE OF VOLCANO MULCHING! Volcano mulching is when mulch gets piled up like a mountain around the trunk of a tree. When mulch is touching the tree trunk, it holds moisture there and doesn't let the tree bark dry (this allows decay and let's insects eat away at the tree's base). So when mulching, be sure to keep it away from the base of the tree.

**I think there's something on my back, can you swat it off?** When there's a bug on your back, you ask a friend to brush it away. So, do the same for your trees. While most bugs that hang out on trees are of no concern, Lincolnshire residents should always be on the lookout for Gypsy Moths. This time of year the next generation of gypsy moths are attached to trees in the form of "egg masses." These fuzzy tan colored masses, about the size of a quarter, contain up to 800 eggs that will hatch into leaf eating caterpillars in the spring. So when you see them, scrape them into a bucket of soapy water. This will kill the eggs and neither you nor the tree will have to deal with the caterpillars come spring. Another nuisance to trees is clinging vines. While vines do not cause problems when they are small, as they grow they can burden and choke a tree. So do your trees a favor by cutting out any vines that get thicker than your thumb.

**I don't feel so good, could you call the doctor?** Just like people, trees can get sick every once in while. So pay attention to signs that your tree may not be feeling well. Discolored leaves, crown dieback, and loose bark are a few things to look for. Most tree disorders are caused by insects, bacteria, or fungi, and many of these problems can be cured. If you think your tree may be sick, call an Arborist or the Village Forester for advice.

With just a little bit of care and attention, you can ensure that your trees will continue to give back to you for years to come. So get to know your trees, and if you have any questions contact, Tony Gliot, the Village Forester, at 847-883-8600.

The following is a list of odds 'n ends that you should know.

### ***Household Chemical Waste Drop Off***

The Solid Waste Agency of Lake County now provides opportunities for residents to take their household chemical waste products to the SWALCO facility. If you don't want to wait until the next Household Chemical Waste Collection event, you may make an appointment with the SWALCO staff to drop your household chemicals off at their facility. Their address is 1311 N. Estes Street in Gurnee (practically a straight shot up Waukegan Road). Their phone number is 847-336-9340 or you can contact them via email at [info@swalco.org](mailto:info@swalco.org). There will be a Chemical Waste Collection in the **Village of Vernon Hills** on Saturday, October 20, 2007, Vernon Hills Metra Train Station, 75 E. Highway 45 (Route 45 & Ranney Road) from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

### ***Recycling Collection***

You need to leave three feet of clearance around your recycling toter cart on collection day. Recycling collection is automated. The driver will not get out of his truck to move your trash container or other materials to get to the recycling toter cart. If you put your recycling toter cart out at the curb and put your trash three feet behind, it does not take up as much entry or exit space from your driveway and will allow the recycling to be collected with the automated truck.

### ***Electronics Collection***

If you do not want to wait for the next Electronics Collection event, you can drop off your electronics at the following locations:

**Village of Wauconda** - 302 Slocum Lake Road - 8:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m., Monday to Friday until October 31st

### ***Disposal of Personal Care Items or Pharmaceuticals***

Left over, expired, or unused personal care products and pharmaceuticals, i.e. prescription and non-prescription drugs, nutritional supplements, cleansing agents, skin care products, etc. should not be put down the drain or toilet. These items get into our water supply and are having an adverse impact on our environment. These items can be taken to the Household Chemical Waste Collection events or the SWALCO facility (by appointment). Pharmaceutical products which are unwanted or expired should be returned where they were purchased if your pharmacy has a "take back" program. If your pharmacy does not, ask them to consider starting one.

These items may be disposed of in the trash if no other options are available. Do not put them down the drain or in the toilet.

- **New Benchmarks Available** - The Village of Lincolnshire has obtained elevation reference marks (benchmarks) for several locations throughout the Village.
