Water and Sewer Rates to Increase Due to Suppliers Costs

Effective on January 15, 2008, with the new fiscal year, the Village's water and sewer rates will be increased. The increases are primarily driven by the cost of purchasing water and the treatment of sanitary sewage.

Water Rates - Water rates will increase by 3%. We purchase our "wholesale" water from the City of Highland Park and its rate to us increased by 2.6% on January 1st. Purchase of water accounts for approximately 60% of our total cost to provide water to our customers. We were able to hold our internal operational costs to a 2.2% increase over FY 2007.

Sewer Rates - Sewer rates will increase by 25% on January 1st. The vast majority of this increase is due to a 52% increase in treatment costs from Lake County, effective March 1st. The cost of treating our sanitary sewer accounts for approximately 64% of our total cost for sanitary sewer collection and treatment. We were able to hold our internal operational costs to a 2.2% increase over FY 2007. The Lake County Board had also approved increases of 26% effective March 1, 2009, and 3% each on March 1, 2010 and March 1, 2011.

Overall - The overall increase for combined water and sewer rates is 13.2%. The average residential customer will see an increase of approximately \$26.60 in their quarterly water and sewer bill, which is equivalent to \$8.87 per month. The average commercial customer will see an increase of approximately \$23.75 in their monthly bill.

Vote Early or Absentee in the General Primary Election on February 5th

Voters who wish to vote absentee by mail may contact the Lake County Absentee Department at 847-377-2406 or visit www.co.lake.il.us/cntyck.

Early voting which became law in August, 2005, gives voters the opportunity to vote early beginning 22 days prior to an election through the Thursday before Election Day. Early voters must present either a valid Illinois driver's license, a non-driver identification card issued by the Illinois Secretary of State, or another government-issued identification document containing the voter's photograph and address.

Early Voting takes place at the Vernon Township Office, 3050 N. Main Street, Buffalo Grove. Early voting will be available beginning January 14th, through the close of business on January 31st, Monday through Friday, 9:00a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

In Person Absentee Vote also takes place at the Township between December 27th and January 14th (same hours as Early Voting). You can also vote at the Lake Count Clerks Office. Call 847-377-2400 for more information.

Green Scene

The Village of Lincolnshire is working aggressively to help reduce the amount of pollutants going into our air. The Village has used B-29 diesel fuel in its diesel fueled vehicles for more than ten years. This fuel is made up of 20% vegetable oil and/or animal fats and 80% ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel.

In addition, the Village received a grant from Clean Air Counts to retrofit several vehicles with oxidizing catalyst mufflers that help to further reduce the amount of emissions into the air.

The Village of Lincolnshire is a member of Clean Air Counts, a northeastern Illinois regional initiative to reduce ozone causing emissions. As a member, have pledged to work on reducing the Village's ozone emissions and to encourage our residents - commercial and residential - to do the same.

There are a number of simple changes you can make to help reduce the amount of emissions in our air.

- Use energy efficient light bulbs.
- Make a list of places you need to go and plot them to make your trip.
- Car pool with friends or neighbors to events and activities.
- Ride your bike or walk when possible during warm weather.
- Seal cracks around windows and doors to reduce heat a efficient as possible.
- Air dry dishes rather than heat drying them in the dish washer.

If each of us would make one small simple change - it all adds up!

Stormwater Manager of the Year

The Lake County Stormwater Management Commission (SMC) has

chosen five recipients to receive its Second Annual Stormwater Awards. Awards



were given out for Stewardship of the Year, Development of the Year, Stormwater Manager of the Year, BMP (Best Management Practice) Project of the Year, and Community of the Year.

The six categories of awards recognize the efforts of individuals, local governments, groups, and others who are advocating, implementing or monitoring projects and programs that improve Lake County watersheds and natural resources.

Lydia Scott, Assistant to the Director of Public Works, was the recipient of the "Stormwater Manager of the Year Award"!

The Lake County Board and members, representatives of the Lake County Stormwater Management Commission and members of the public were present at the award ceremony held on December 6, 2007.

Log Cabins

The Illinois Department of Transportation opened bids for the demolition of the two log cabins and one detached 3-car garage on November 16, 2007. Grace Development CP, Incorporated, of Wood Dale, IL, bid \$229,007.90 to complete the work.

The demolition of the cabins and the restoration of the property is expected to be completed by Spring 2008.

During the work, the hiking and recreation path may be closed from time to time. Although this can be an inconvenience, it will be done to ensure the safety of the path users.

Waste Management Fee Increase

Waste Management will be raising its fees to Village residents by 3.06% beginning in January. The fee increase is based on a formula that includes increases to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) or tipping fees. There is no increase in the tipping fee, but there is an increase to the CPI. Only a portion of that increase is allowed under the Village's contract with Waste Management.

Let it Snow, Let it Snow, Let it Snow!

December usually brings cold, blustery weather to the Village. Snow and ice can make the streets of Lincolnshire hazardous for travel. The Public Works Department employees are preparing the snow and ice removal equipment so they will be ready to make the streets of the Village safe for travel as quickly as possible when the snow falls. You should be aware of some facts and policies regarding snow removal.

The Village is responsible for the maintenance of over 40 miles of roadway including seventy-three cul-de-sacs. These areas do not include Half Day Road, Olde Half Day Road (East) and Milwaukee Avenue, which are maintained by the State; Riverwoods and Aptakisic Roads, which are maintained by the County; and any of the private subdivisions such as Westminster Woods, Wood Creek Courts, Rivershire, Indian Creek, Heritage Creek, Hidden Lakes, Sutton Place, Village Green Condos, Beaconsfield and Westgate.

Cleaning our roadways of snow and ice can take up to six hours once the precipitation has stopped falling. Please try to avoid making any unnecessary trips until the snow plows have had a chance to clear the snow. Also, please be aware of the fact that parking on the roadways after there is an accumulation of one inch or more of snow is prohibited by the Village Code. Keeping the streets free of traffic and parked cars will allow the snow plows to clear the roads much more efficiently.

The snow plows will leave some snow at the end of the driveways. It is the resident's responsibility to clear this snow, and it is against Village policy for Village trucks to plow the openings of individual driveways.

At times, snow is intentionally deposited or pushed into the streets or onto the roadway shoulder. This is usually done by privately contracted snow plowing services. Residents who utilize snow plowing firms should advise them that it is against Village Code to deposit snow on to Village streets and neighboring properties. You should make sure that any snow removed from your driveway or other areas of your property remains on your property, unless you have permission to have it plowed on to a neighbor's property.

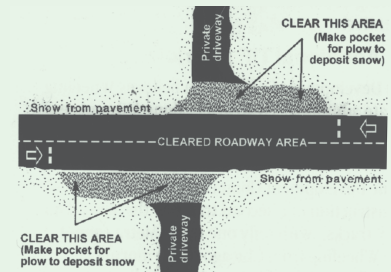
Now is a good time to prepare your property for the inclement weather. If your sump pump discharges into the street, please move it so it discharges into your yard. This will prevent an ice buildup in front of your house making the streets safer for travel by motorists and pedestrians. Also, please check your mailbox to make sure it is installed properly and is in good condition. The Village will only repair mailboxes that are actually struck by the snow plow.

Village crews are careful to avoid damaging property as they plow, but because the snow can sometimes obscure the line between the curb and the lawn, accidents do happen. If you discover damage to your lawn or mailbox after the snow plows have passed, please call Wendy Moderhack at 847-883-8600 during normal business hours. The Public Works Department will make repairs as soon as possible. However, landscape restoration cannot be done until the Spring. By following these guidelines, we can all have a safe, winter season!

Tips for Shoveling Your Snow

The best way to assure that the snow plows clearing the street will minimize the amount of snow left in your already cleared driveway is to shovel snow to your right as you face the street, and also make a pocket on the left side of your driveway. See illustration.

Snow that has accumulated on the



plow will dump into that pocket and not entirely on your cleared driveway.

By doing this, you will reduce the possibility of snow plows inadvertently making your driveway snow-bound again.

Clear Your Fire Hydrant

There are 800 fire hydrants in the Village. It is difficult for Public Works personnel to be able to locate and shovel out each of these fire hydrants should they become covered with snow.

For you and your neighbor's sake, if you have a fire hydrant on your property, we ask that you clear the snow around it. If a fire occurs in your neighborhood, it is important that the fire department locate the necessary fire hydrants quickly. Thanks for your help!

Nature's Edge



Winter Wonderland

The Village is recognized in the region for its outstanding environmental efforts in protecting our natural heritage. These efforts are very evident in the North Park/Florsheim/Old Mill Nature Preserves and Rivershire Park. The Village works to eradicate non native invasive species to improve habitat for wildlife and biological diversity of native plant species. In addition, the eradication of these non native species make nature easier to access and more beautiful to view.

Come visit these beautiful natural areas over the coming winter months. The paths are well chipped and maintained to provide for easy access. During snow events cross country skiing is a wonderful pastime and can be very exhilarating. Snow shoeing is great exercise and is another excellent way to visit these sites during the winter months.

Bring small children on a sled. They can see nature first hand by observing animal tracks, nests and activity. Animals you might see on your adventure include: beaver, coyotes, deer, racoons, opossums, squirrels, hawks, rabbits, owls, cardinals, mice, voles, etc. These animals live in a wide variety of habitat. Look for holes or nests in trees, holes in the ground, track marks going into tall grasses or piles of brush. See if you can see tracks going down to the water where they may be fishing for mussels or other species for their food. Sometimes you will see bones or fur along the paths where an animal has eaten a meal.

The Village provides, at no charge, Explorer Backpacks. These Backpacks are filled with nature guides, activities, and equipment to make your visits into our natural areas an adventure. Call the Village at 847-883-8600 to arrange to pick one up. Visit our natural areas over the winter and see firsthand our beautiful "Winter Wonderland".

Ice Skating in the Village

There are two parks in the Village that provide opportunities for ice skating in the winter.

Spring Lake Park provides open skating from dawn to dusk -- when ice thickness is appropriate. Skaters should be aware that it takes at least six inches of ice before it is safe to skate on the lake. (Keep in mind that the lake is 14 feet deep in some spots.) **Signs will be posted on the beach end of the lake advising users when it is safe to skate. Watch for signs at the park indicating that it is open for skating or check for information on Cable Channel 10.**



North Park provides **two** locations for skating. The front rink (surrounded by hay bales) is for **hockey**, and the back rink (behind the concession/restroom/warming building) is available for **figure skating**. **Watch for signs at the park that indicate the ice is ready for skating.**

At North Park the concession/restroom/warming building provides an opportunity for skaters to come in out of the cold. The walkway, adjacent to the restrooms, has radiant heaters. The heaters are operated by a push button on the wall. Happy skating!

No Skating or Sledding at Rivershire Park

Please be aware that there is no skating or sledding allowed at Rivershire Park.

Skating is strictly prohibited due to uncertain ice conditions. Warm currents in Lincolnshire Creek and the Des Plaines River make ice conditions dangerous. If you wish to skate, go to Spring Lake Park or North Park when signs state that ice conditions are safe. Rivershire Park does not have any hills adequate for sledding. Hills adjacent to Rivershire Park are located on private property. Please be advised that these areas are not for public use.

Open Gym

The Open Gym Program continues on Sundays, through March 16th, at Half Day School from 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. There will be two gyms available. Children under 12 years old must be accompanied by an adult who must remain on the premises. Basketball may be played. A one-time season release is required before anyone is allowed to participate, and the weekly fee is \$3.00. Releases will also be available at both the Village Hall and during Open Gym. Parents should not drop off children at Half Day School without being sure that releases have been signed.
