Commercial Wastehauler Franchise

The Village has requested proposals from regional wastehaulers to provide franchised wastehauling services to our commercial and multifamily housing residents. The reason the Village is pursuing this request for proposals is because several other communities have done so and have obtained significantly lower prices for their businesses and residents than previously charged by the wastehaulers. The Village has not formed a decision on this issue and will not until it has had a chance to review the proposals. Public discussion will be held regarding the results of the request for proposals. Let it Snow, Let it Snow, Let it Snow!

December usually brings cold, blustery weather to the Village. Snow and ice can make the streets of Lincolnshire hazardous for travel. The Public Works Department employees are preparing the snow and ice removal equipment so they will be ready to make the streets of the Village safe for travel as quickly as possible when the snow falls. You should be aware of some facts and policies regarding snow removal.

The Village is responsible for the maintenance of over 40 miles of roadway including seventy-three cul-de-sacs. These areas do not include Half Day Road, Olde Half Day Road (East of Milwaukee Avenue) and Milwaukee Avenue, which are maintained by the State; Riverwoods and Aptakisic Roads, which are maintained by the County; and any of the private subdivisions such as Westminster Woods, Wood Creek Courts, Rivershire, Indian Creek, Heritage Creek, Hidden Lakes, Sutton Place, Village Green Condos, Beaconsfield and Westgate.

Cleaning our roadways of snow and ice can take up to six hours once the precipitation has stopped falling. Please try to avoid making any unnecessary trips until the snow plows have had a chance to clear the snow. Also, please be aware of the fact that parking on the roadways after there is an accumulation of one inch or more of snow is prohibited by the Village Code. Keeping the streets free of traffic and parked cars will allow the snow plows to clear the roads much more efficiently.

The snow plows will leave some snow at the end of the driveways. It is the resident's responsibility to clear this snow, and it is against Village policy for Village trucks to plow the openings of individual driveways.

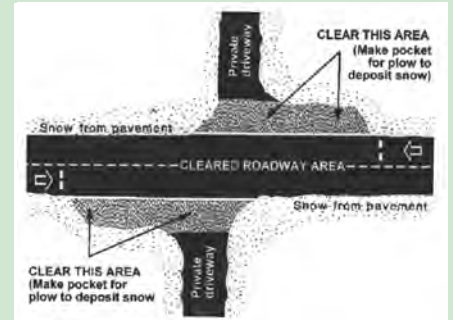
At times, snow is intentionally deposited or pushed into the streets or onto the roadway shoulder. This is usually done by privately contracted snow plowing services. Residents who utilize snow plowing firms should advise them that it is against Village Code to deposit snow on to Village streets and neighboring properties, and you should make sure that any snow removed from your driveway or other areas of your property remains on your property, unless you have permission to have it plowed on to a neighbor's property.

Now is a good time to prepare your property for the inclement weather. If your sump pump discharges into the street, please move it so it discharges into your yard. This will prevent an ice buildup in front of your house making the streets safer for travel by motorists and pedestrians. Also, please check your mailbox to make sure it is installed properly and is in good condition. The Village will only repair mailboxes that are actually struck by the snow plow.

Village crews are careful to avoid damaging property as they plow, but because the snow can sometimes obscure the line between the curb and the lawn, accidents do happen. If you discover damage to your lawn or mailbox after the snow plows have passed, please call Wendy Moderhack at 847.913.2380 during normal business hours. The Public Works Department will make repairs as soon as possible. However, landscape restoration cannot be done until the Spring. By following these guidelines, we can all have a safe winter season!

Tips for Shoveling Your Snow

The best way to assure that the snow plows clearing the street will minimize the amount of snow left in your already cleared driveway is to shovel snow to your right as you face the street, and also make a pocket on the left side of your driveway. See illustration.



Snow that has accumulated on the plow will dump into that pocket and not entirely on your cleared driveway.

By doing this, you will reduce the possibility of snow plows inadvertently making your driveway snow-bound again.

Clear Your Fire Hydrant

There are 800 fire hydrants in the Village. It is difficult for Public Works personnel to be able to locate and shovel out each of these fire hydrants should they become covered with snow. For your and your neighbor's sake, if you have a fire hydrant adjacent to your property, we ask that you clear the snow around it. If a fire occurs in your neighborhood, it is important that the fire department locate the necessary fire hydrants quickly. Thanks for your help!

Wastehauler Pick Up

Because Christmas Day and New Year's Day fall on a Friday this year, the single-family residential homes' garbage and recyclable will be picked up by Waste Management on your normal pick-up day, Wednesday, December 23rd, and Wednesday, December 30th.



Snow and Ice Control - Using Technology to Improve Service

This year marks the second full season of utilizing equipment to blend and apply liquid snow and ice control products to the roadways. This technology has allowed the Village to reduce the quantity of road salt while maintaining the same high level of service by keeping the streets clean during and after winter storms.

For several years, the Village has been evaluating the effectiveness of anti-icing products which are used in two basic concepts. One is a pre-storm application, where a liquid is sprayed on the pavement, dries and is activated when precipitation occurs. Initially, the Public Works Department will be treating the major intersections and curves throughout the Village prior to a snow or ice storm. Once the product is applied, it will help melt any frozen precipitation up to several hours, depending on the storm's intensity. This will keep the treated areas wet instead of snow or ice covered until Public Works crews can respond with other snow and ice control measures.

The second concept is a blend of liquids applied directly to rock salt as it is being placed on the roadways. These products contain a protein made from natural agricultural products such as corn or beets that assist in keeping the salt on the roadway so less is introduced into the environment. The liquid also activates the heating element in the salt which allows it to work faster and more efficiently. These techniques are designed to reduce impacts to the environment and allow for the most effective snow and ice control in a broad range of temperatures and storm intensities.

These methods will allow for the Village's Snow and Ice Control Program to be more efficient and environmentally friendly. It should assist in providing safer travel more quickly. However, residents are advised to continue to use caution and slow down while driving when winter weather strikes the Village.

Child Safety Seats

With the holidays approaching, residents should be aware that the Village loans infant and toddler booster seats, without charge, on a first-come, first-serve basis. If you have relatives or friends with children coming into town for the upcoming holidays and need an infant, toddler or booster seat, call 847.883.9900 to reserve your seat. Please call early. The supply is limited!



We have two rear-facing infant seats that can be used for children 5 to 22 pounds; two rear-facing convertible seats for 5-30 pounds and forward-facing seats for children 20-40 pounds, and at least 1 year of age if forward facing. We also have 3 booster seats for children 40-100 pounds. All of the seats are equipped to be used with the LATCH systems in all new vehicles.

When you call to reserve a seat, you need to know the exact age, height and weight of the child so that we can determine if the proper seat is available.

The Building

The Building Square is a quarterly feature, in which the Building Division of the Community Development Department will present information intended to provide useful advice to our residents about building-related topics. Our goal is to provide you with information that can assist you with building projects you may undertake in the future, to help understand why problems may have occurred in the past, and to relay some of the experiences and responsibilities our division faces throughout the year. Should you have any questions or comments regarding building-related topics, please send them to us, and we may use your query in one of our quarterly features.

Keeping A Construction Archive

When doing substantial remodeling work around your home, it is a good idea to create an archive binder. The binder should contain your permit documents, blueprints, contracts and photos of the work in progress. Photos can be especially useful for future reference and for “seeing through walls” at a later date. A photo of a framed wall before drywall is applied will let you see where hidden electrical, plumbing, heating, and various obstructions may be located before you decide to do additional future work.

Keeping the contracts and contact information for the contractors who work on your house, as well as receipts from suppliers, may help you locate replacement items such as millwork, windows, doors, even paint colors if any of these items are damaged or worn out.

One of the many benefits to properly permitting work in your home is that the Village keeps the approved permit documents on permanent file. Should you wish to perform additions or renovations, there is a good possibility that we have some of the documents from previous permitted work on file.

Remember to keep your archive binder in a safe location, and pass it on to future owners.

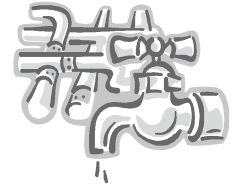

Tax Levy Ordinance To Be Considered by the Village Board

At the December 14th Regular Village Board Meeting beginning at 7:00 p.m, the Village Board will consider the 2010 Tax Levy. This is the fourteenth consecutive year the Tax Levy will be used only for employee pensions and not for general operations or debt service. Overall, the Village's portion of the total property tax bill is expected to remain about 3%.

How to Prevent Frozen Pipes



Frozen pipes can be the source of costly damage and necessitate extensive repairs to many homes in our area each winter. There are several things that can be done to help prevent freezing and the possibility of major damage.

- Remember to remove garden hoses and attachments from outside faucets.
- Fill gaps and cracks around the outside of your home with fiberglass insulation, expanding foam, mortar, caulk or a combination of the above to minimize cold air infiltration to the inside of the home. (This will also help keep out insects and rodents looking for a warm place to spend the winter.)
- Insulate water pipes exposed to cold temperatures inside your home with foam insulation. This is especially important in older homes with unheated crawl spaces or cellars.

The first clue of a frozen pipe is reduced water flow to a certain area of your home. This could be a faucet that will not deliver water or possibly a dishwasher or icemaker that stops working. As water in the pipe freezes, it expands to form an icy “plug” inside the pipe. This plug can easily expand enough to burst a copper pipe. It is usually when this plug starts to thaw that the water begins to flow freely from the burst pipe.

If you should notice evidence of a frozen pipe or if you discover a leak, turn off the water at the meter. There is a valve on either side of your water meter with a lever handle or knob that can be turned off to stop the flow of water to the house. Leave the faucets open in all the sinks and tubs to allow excess water to drain out.

Never try to thaw frozen pipes with a torch or open flame. It is less expensive to repair some water damage than to burn the house down. Often times, a hair dryer can be used to thaw a frozen pipe. Always contact a licensed plumber to make repairs to damaged water pipes in your home.
