Columbaria in Lincolnshire

After over a year of significant discussion and consideration, the Village Board approved a change to the Village of Lincolnshire's Zoning Regulations to now permit memorial assembly facilities (columbaria) as Special Uses in the Village. The final 5-1 vote was taken at the November 24, 2008 Village Board meeting.

While there are no current requests filed with the Village for construction of a memorial assembly facility (columbaria), there has been interest expressed in the past. In an effort to establish specific criteria that could be used to evaluate such a request, the Village Board requested that the Planning Staff conduct research and propose development standards for consideration. These facilities are typically found on religious institution properties and include a memorial wall with niches containing ashes and a memorial plaque.

The following is a brief summary of the approved text amendments that apply to Special Uses within the R1, R2, R2A, R3, R4, and R5 Single-Family Residence Districts:

1. A Memorial Assembly Facility shall only be permitted as an accessory use to an assembly use (for example, religious institutions or schools).
2. Shall be permitted:
 - inside the main building on the lot, or
 - as an accessory structure, subject to the following design and setback standards:
 - Shall be located a minimum of 100 feet from any lot line where there is street frontage;
 - Shall maintain a minimum distance of 135 feet from any side and rear lot line;
 - Shall be located a minimum of 20 feet from the main building on the lot;
 - Shall be comprised of an area no greater than 600 square feet;
 - The structure shall not be taller than 3 feet;
 - The structure shall be concealed from the adjacent street and residential lots with landscaping that provides complete screening during the entire year and shall be a minimum 6 feet tall at the time of planting (This landscaping shall not be considered part of the 600-square foot area.); and

Breeding Season For Coyotes

February and early March are breeding season for coyotes. Pups are born approximately 60 days later in late April or May. Coyotes will be more active in February and early March so you may hear more howling and see more activity.



If you don't want coyotes in your yard, do not provide an "attractive nuisance". This would be any food source, i.e., garbage, pet food, food compost, etc.; or a home source, i.e., wood pile, access points under porches or decks, holes in the ground, etc. If you see coyotes regularly in your yard, make their visit uncomfortable, bang on pots, sound a horn, etc.

Coyotes are an important part of our native ecosystem and are wild animals. If you are attracting them to your yard - stop. Ultimately, this will become a problem for you and the coyote. Let them live their life as they should, wild and without our interference.

Columbarium in Lincolnshire

- The face of the structure where the cremated human remains are interned must substantially face toward the main building on the lot.

These regulations will be used in the event a proposal for a memorial assembly facility (columbaria) is filed with the Village. As with all Special Use requests, all owners within 250 feet of the parcel seeking any request will receive written notice by certified mail, at least 15 days in advance of any scheduled public hearing.

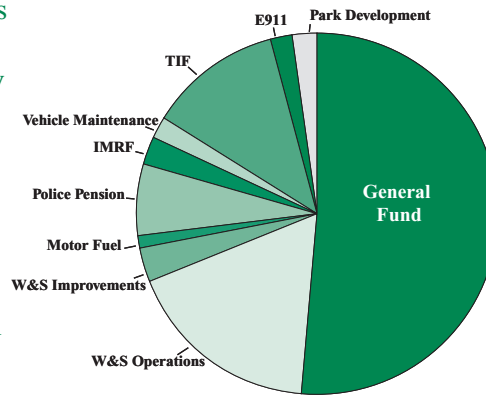

2009 Village Budget Overview

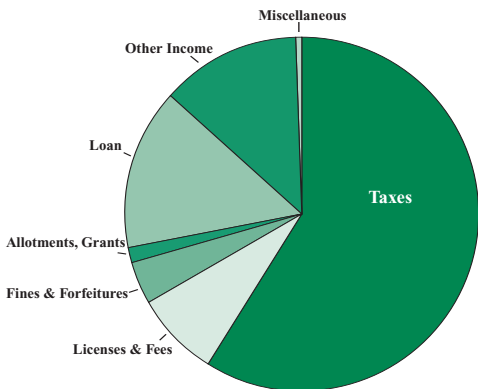
Lincolnshire's Fiscal Year 2009 began on January 1st. Total revenues are \$27,196,500 and total expenditures are \$26,602,500. The Budget is balanced with revenues exceeding expenditures. The Budget is only \$16,200 more than in FY 2008. The accompanying pie chart illustrates the percentages of the Village's ten (10) funds. The largest funds are the General Fund and the Water & Sewer Operating Fund, followed by the Tax Increment Financing District Fund and the Police Pension Fund. The Village only levies a property tax for its two (2) employee pension funds and not for general operations.

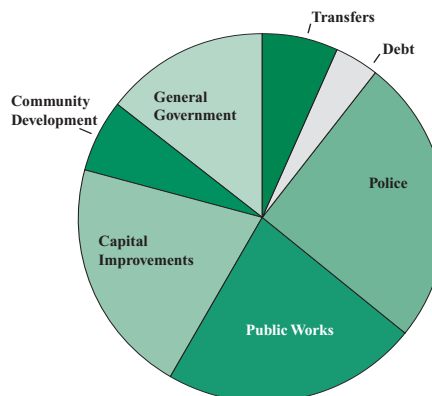

The General Fund is the largest operational component of the Budget. It contains the programs and services most common to municipal government. These include General Government (Administration, Finance, Legal, Insurance), Police, Community Development (Planning, Building, Zoning and Forestry), Public Works (Streets, Parks, Open Space and Recreation) and Capital Debt. The chart to the left shows the breakdown of revenues for the General Fund. Within the Tax category, Sales Tax, Utility Tax, Telecommunications Tax and Room and Admission Tax account for 67% of the total General Fund Revenues.

The breakdown of the General Fund expenditures can be seen in the chart to the right. The largest expenditure this year is in Capital Improvements. Normally this is not the case, but one project (the reconstruction of Schelter Road, estimated to be \$2,050,000) equals 60% of the Capital Program. Without this project, the Capital Program would have a more typical year and be approximately 13% of the total rather than 25%. Other capital improvements include the Village's annual street resurfacing program, vehicle and equipment replacement and improvements to four (4) of the Village's parks. Most of the projects are related to maintaining or improving existing property and facilities.

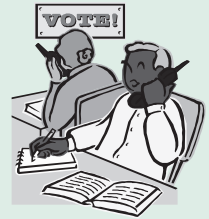

In non-General Fund Capital Improvements, the Village will complete several sections of the Pedestrian/Bike Path System, including the eastern piece along Route 22 that will connect to the new I-94 bridge; water and sewer system rehabilitation projects and infrastructure improvements on the Village-owned property in the downtown TIF District.

Three Trustee Terms Up in Consolidated Election on April 7th

Three Trustee seats will be decided in the April 7th election: Trustee Liz Brandt, Trustee David Saltiel, and Trustee Gary Walrath. This NewsLetter will be going to press prior to the final day that candidate petitions can be turned in, which is January 26th. Candidate Signage

The Village Code regulates the size of political signs. The maximum size for political signs is six square feet, which is the size of a standard 2 x 3 foot sign and it cannot be any higher than four feet off the ground.



All political signs must be displayed no more than thirty-six days prior to and removed within two days after an election. Since the election is on Tuesday, April 7th this year, no political signs should go up before Tuesday, March 2nd and they should be taken down by Thursday, April 9th. Since the wastehaulers come through the Village on Wednesday, April 8th, it's a good idea to take the signs out of your yard and put them at the curb at the same time you put out your waste and recycleables.

Signs must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowner. Private property typically begins fifteen feet from the roadway. Rights-of-way along roads such as Riverwoods Road, Route 22 and Milwaukee Avenue are not private property. Any signage along these roadways must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowners. **Any signage not meeting this criteria will be removed by the Village staff.**

Open Gym

The Village offers an Open Gym Program on Sundays, through March 22nd, at Half Day School from 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. There are two gyms available. Children under 12 years old must be accompanied by an adult who must remain on the premises. Either basketball or volleyball may be played. A one-time season release is required before anyone is allowed to participate and the weekly fee is \$3.00. Releases were sent home with children in School District #103 and they are available at both the Village Hall and during Open Gym. Parents should not drop off children at Half Day School without being sure that releases have been signed. Questions? Call Stephanie Gould at 847-913-2363.

Did You Know

The Village of Lincolnshire has specific regulations regarding the use and storage of refuse containers (Village Code Title 8, Chapter 4-13). The following guidelines have been established in order to maintain the appearance of the Village:



1. The owner or occupant of a residential dwelling may not place any refuse out for pickup service before 9:00 p.m. on the day before a scheduled pickup. Additionally, these containers must be removed from the street no later than 9:00 p.m. on the day of a scheduled collection.
2. The owner or occupant of a residential dwelling must provide a location on their premises where refuse containers may be stored on days between scheduled pickups. These locations must be maintained in an orderly manner and refuse containers should not be visible from the street or placed in an area that would be considered offensive or a nuisance to immediate adjoining neighbors.

Garden Spot

Lincolnshire's formal gardens have long been a source of community pride and enjoyment. In an effort to continue in this tradition, all streetscape gardens were completely renovated during October, 2008. Some existing beds were enlarged, soils were amended, the numbers of higher performing plantings were increased, lower performers were removed, and new beds were designed and installed.



Because of the Public Works staff's experience in working in these gardens which are subjected to the worst possible conditions-winter, salt, deer, automobile pollution, pedestrian traffic-as well as the normal demands of mid-west gardens and because of the continuing effort to provide the best possible floral display with the least possible impact on the environment, we'd like to pass along tips regarding maintenance and plant selections that can be useful to Lincolnshire residents. Therefore, throughout the 2009 growing season, **GARDEN SPOT** will provide resident gardeners with the following information:

Celebrity Plant of the Month

GARDEN SPOT will feature one perennial or shrub from the Village plant list and will include a photo, description, cultural requirements and maintenance advice for the selection.

Gardening Tip of the Month

GARDEN SPOT will focus on one gardening task relevant to the growing cycle. Topics will include plant selection, fertilizing, pest control, thinning, cutting back, dividing, weeding and watering.

Looking for something to do while waiting for spring to finally make its debut?

1. Inventory your garden tools to determine what replacements will need to be made.
2. Clean garden tools:
 - Remove dirt with wire brush.
 - Remove rust with steel wool or light sandpaper.
 - Apply a lubricant oil to metal parts.
 - Apply linseed oil to wooden handles.
3. Prune dormant shrubs (not spring flowering plants) to control growth, rejuvenate or accentuate their natural beauty.

Snow Plow Damage

Village crews are careful and try to avoid damaging property as they plow the snow, but because the snow can sometimes obscure the line between the curb and the lawn, accidents do happen. If you discover damage to your lawn or mailbox after the snow plows have passed, call Wendy Moderhack, at 847-913-2380 during normal business hours. The Public Works Department will determine if the Village is responsible and will make repairs as soon as possible. However, landscape restoration cannot be done until the Spring.



One Hundred Year Flood Defined

“Does a 100-year flood occur once every 100 years?” is a question that we hear frequently when people discuss floodplains. By definition, a 100-year flood, also known as the “base flood,” is a flood that has a one percent (1%) chance of occurring in any given year (for other probabilities, see the table below). The area susceptible to flooding during the base flood is called the Special Flood Hazard Area or floodplain. The elevation of the water for a flood event of a given probability is determined by engineers by studying rainfall intensities, stream and river cross-sections, and topography.

Chances of Structure in the floodplain being flooded:

Studies suggest that during the 30-year life of a typical mortgage, a structure located within the 100-year floodplain has a 26 percent (26%) chance of experiencing flooding, but a four percent (4%) chance of experiencing a fire. This statistic is the reason why flood insurance coverage is mandatory for structures whose mortgage is backed by the federal government. Remember, your general homeowners insurance policy DOES NOT cover losses from floods. Therefore, even if you do not live in the Special Flood Hazard Area, you should consider purchasing flood insurance. There is a 30 day waiting period before a new policy goes into effect. Don't wait for the flood to purchase insurance.
