The results of the April 7, 2009 Consolidated Election are as follows:

David Saltiel	425 votes



Lincolnshire has 5,139 registered voters, and 425 residents voted in this election which is the equivalent of 8% of the registered voters. This election was uncontested.

Does Someone in Your Home Need Assistance?

Is there someone in your residence who may need special attention or assistance in the event of an emergency, a severe weather event or evacuation?

If there is someone in your residence who is immobile or confined to a bed or wheelchair, we want to know. Or if someone is oxygen-dependent, on a portable dialysis machine, or has a physical or mental handicap which may prevent or limit them from assisting themselves, we want to know.

There have been flooding situations along the Des Plaines River where residents have been evacuated and we would like to know who these folks are and where they live so we can give attention to them first. Also, in the event of a prolonged power outage, severe weather or such other calamity where residents may need our assistance, we want to prioritize our response and not overlook someone in need who may not be able to get word to us.

If you have a need for our special attention, please contact Chief of Police Randy Melvin directly by sending an email, fax, calling him, or writing him with your information. We will include it in our emergency response plans. Your information will be kept confidential and will be used only in emergency situations. Route 22 Tollway Construction

The contractor for the Route 22 Tollway bridge reconstruction work has recently established an **approximate three week ramp closure for both the southbound and the northbound tollway ramps at Route 22!**



The ramps are tentatively scheduled to be closed in mid June. Please note that this timeline is weather dependent, and therefore subject to change.

Water Meter Readings

The Village of Lincolnshire's Water Department will be reading inside water meters for single family homes located south of Route 22 and east of Riverwoods Road. Inspections will be performed from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, beginning June 1st over a period of two months. Inside meter readings are taken every third year to verify that the inside meter matches the outside meter readings. To eliminate the need to enter each house quarterly, the outside meter is read to determine the owner's water usage. This program assures you the accuracy of the meter readings.



This program also includes a mandated inspection of your plumbing system and sump pumps. The average time required per property is about ten minutes.

It's Tick Season!



The summer weather brings the ticks out and we need to be on the watch for these little bugs. There are two types of ticks in our area, the American dog tick (wood tick) and the deer tick (black-legged tick). Dog ticks are larger than the deer tick and do not carry Lyme disease. These are the most common ticks in our area.

Deer ticks are much smaller - about 1/8 inch. They can be dark brown to bright red in color. They have black legs and are becoming more common. Deer ticks carry Lyme disease.

Testing in Lake County showed that 37% of the deer ticks tested showed positive for Lyme disease. Be sure to check yourself, your family members and pets frequently for ticks. If you find a tick embedded in a pet or human, take care when removing it not to squeeze it. Use a pair of tweezers, grasping the tick near the mouth parts and gently pull the tick in a steady, upward motion. Be sure to clean the area with a disinfectant. Record the date and location of the bite and watch for early symptoms of Lyme disease, i.e. a red rash that occurs at the site of the bite and/or the center of the bite area may be clear with a rash extending outwards.

To avoid ticks:

Clear leaf litter from under trees and keep the ground clean under bird feeders.

- Keep grass near playground equipment short.
- Install a wood chip or gravel barrier between lawns and wooded or tall grass areas.
- Minimize wood piles as these are attractive to small mammals such as mice, which can carry ticks.
- Avoid tick habitat by staying on trails when in forest preserves and parks.
- Wear light colored, protective clothing.
- Apply insect repellent containing DEET primarily to clothes.
- Walk in the center of trails so plants do not brush against you.
- Check yourself, children and other family members every two to three hours for ticks.
- If your pets spend time outdoors, regularly check them for ticks too.
- Prompt removal of ticks helps to prevent infection.

In order to transmit disease, a deer tick must be attached to the skin for at least 24 hours. Symptoms of Lyme disease include “bull’s eye” rash or lesions around the site of the bite (usually 7 to 14 days after the tick has consumed a blood meal), fever, fatigue, headache, muscle aches, and/or joint aches. If you experience any of these symptoms seven days or more following a known tick bite, you should contact your physician.

Mosquito Abatement Program

The Mayor and Board of Trustees want every resident to be informed of the effort the Village is putting forth regarding the Mosquito Abatement Program and the West Nile Virus. The Village has teamed up with Clarke Environmental Mosquito Control to administer our integrated program.



West Nile Virus is a mosquito-borne disease. Symptoms of the disease initially are similar to the flu. The majority of individuals infected with the disease will never know it. The symptoms will be so mild they will go undetected. In severe cases, the disease may cause encephalitis, paralysis, coma or death. Individuals with compromised immune systems and senior citizens are at greatest risk.

The Village of Lincolnshire has contracted with Clarke Environmental Mosquito Control for a sophisticated abatement program. This integrated approach includes mosquito traps for monitoring numbers of insects, prevention of larval mosquito development in stormwater catch basins, and insect-eating fish used in detention basins.

When the mosquito count elevates, the Village will provide adult mosquito control. This is the most effective method for controlling mosquitoes and the West Nile Virus once the insect matures. Even with this comprehensive program in place, the cooperation of each Lincolnshire resident is needed.

Protect yourself during daylight hours, especially at sunrise and just before and after sunset:

- Wear light colored, long-sleeved tops and long pants.
- Consider applying insect repellent that contains DEET with 14% to 25% Diethylmeta-toluamide to exposed skin (Off® or Cutter® are common brands).

Prevent mosquito breeding around your home:

- Dispose of all standing water in buckets, cans or any water-holding container outdoors.
- At least once a week empty water from bird baths and plant-pot drip trays.
- Keep roof gutters clean and free of debris.

Having an outdoor party?

- Use a fogger or spray insecticide on foliage near and around the party site just prior to the arrival of guests.
- Have insect repellent for guests in a prominent place.

West Nile Virus

The Lake County Health Department has reactivated its West Nile Virus Hotline. The WNV hotline, 847-377-8300, provides information about West Nile Virus and allows residents to report dead bird sightings (crows and blue jays), which can indicate the virus is in the region, as well as neglected pools and other conditions conducive to mosquito breeding.

The Clark Mosquito Hotline, 800-942-2555, has also been activated to allow residents to report standing water or to be placed on its night spraying Prior Notification list.

Please report dead bird sightings to the Lake County Health Department's WNV Hotline. This dead bird information is utilized by Clarke in coordination with the Lake County Health Department surveillance program.

Resident Input Requested!

Garden Spot

Celebrity plant of the month is Rosa rugosa 'Pavement Series'.



Shrub roses are easy to grow; are available in a variety of sizes, shapes, and colors; are low maintenance; and are an integral part of the Village's effort to provide season long flower display in all public gardens. Village gardens boast an inventory of over 1100 shrub rose plants! Lincolnshire's garden plant palette consists of 4 varieties of shrub roses, all of which are disease resistant and are used in gardens according to the design and cultural specifications of a particular site. When a garden is particularly vulnerable to winter salt spray and radiant pavement heat, however, the shrub rose of choice is Rosa rugosa 'Pavement Series'. All Rugosa roses are salt and heat tolerant, drought tolerant, disease resistant, and winter hardy. They come in a variety of colors and sizes and are useful as hedges, foundation plantings, and mixed border garden beds. Many have fragrant flowers and attractive ornamental remnant "hips" (fruits). The 'Pavement Series' is low spreading, compact in size (3'x 3'), has great foliage and semi-double fragrant flowers, repeat blooms, and produces large red hips. It is important to remember that all shrub roses require full sun.

Gardening Tip of the Month: Exercise caution when using herbicides.

Above average spring rainfall has made resident landscapes green and lush. It has also created a healthy crop of weeds. Garden centers sell chemical products called herbicides to control these weeds. While these chemicals are effective in weed control, they can be dangerous to people, pets, and the environment. It is important to do the following when purchasing and using herbicides:

1. Identify the weed you are targeting and be sure the product you are purchasing is suitable for that weed. Garden center staff can help you.
2. Read the product label thoroughly before using. Pesticide use is controlled by the Federal government and all products are required to carry a label which outlines directions for use and precautions. Use recommended dosage-more is not better!
3. When herbiciding, cover arms and legs and wear shoes, socks, and goggles.

Important Information

- **Sprinkling Restrictions** - Outside water usage is restricted in the Village between May 15th and September 15th. If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8), then you may use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), you may use outside water on calendar days which are odd.
- **Dumping in drainage ditches** and detention basins is prohibited by Village Code. A fine will be assessed to anyone in violation. Questions? Call Rob Horne, Engineering Supervisor, at 847-913-2366.
- **Waste Management North is the single waste hauler for most residents in Lincolnshire.** If you have questions or problems, the waste hauler can be reached at 800-796-9696 or 630-724-8400. However, if you are a member of a Homeowners' Association, your home is not necessarily covered by Waste Management North. Check with your Homeowners' Association for more information.
- **If you have any old major appliances you wish to discard, call Environmental Field Service at 800-480-4337.** This service will collect these appliances for a fee that is much lower than what Waste Management North would charge.
- **Problems with Comcast Broadband Cable?** Call its Customer Service Department at 866-594-1234. **Comcast Internet** - call 888-262-6300, and **Comcast Telephone** - call 800-266-2278. **Unburied cable?** If you don't get satisfaction, contact Carol Marshall at the Village of Lincolnshire - 847-913-2334.
