Spring Cleanup, Saturday, April 25th

Start preparing now for the Annual Spring Cleanup. It will be held on Saturday, April 25th.

Residents may put out household goods with the exception of "white goods" (appliances), household chemical waste and landscape waste. Items such as carpeting or lumber must be bundled in lengths not more than 4 feet long and two feet in diameter. All items must be of such a size that one person can lift them.



All goods must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the morning of the pickup. Residents may begin placing items at the curb after 7:00 p.m. the night before.

Change Your Clocks

Daylight Saving Time will begin on Sunday morning, March 8th, at 2:00 a.m.

When you set your clock ahead, take the time to change the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. This simple act could save your life and the lives of your family.

Earth Hour

On March 28, 2009, people around the world will be making a small gesture to recognize the Earth by turning off their lights for one hour. This event, dubbed Earth Hour, will be observed locally between 8:30 and 9:30 p.m. Central Time. Residents are encouraged to turn off non-essential lights and to replace those lights with energy-efficient compact fluorescent bulbs before turning them back on. - An Ordinance amending the Village Code to remove the 50¢ fee for Bicycle Licensing and to remove this fee from the Comprehensive Fee Schedule.



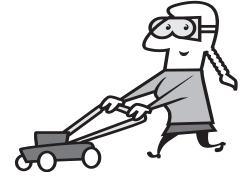

Compact Fluorescent Bulbs!

Hopefully we are all starting to use compact fluorescent bulbs (CFLs) instead of the traditional incandescent light bulbs. 75% less energy is used when a traditional bulb is replaced with a CFL bulb! A simple change can make a big difference.

CFL bulbs, like traditional fluorescent bulbs, contain a very small amount of mercury. (A CFL bulb contains approximately 4 milligrams. An old traditional thermometer contains about 500 milligrams.) As long as the bulb is not broken, there is no problem with the mercury.

If a CFL bulb gets broken, the following steps should be taken:

1. Have people and pets leave the room.
2. Open a window and leave the room for 15 minutes or more.
3. Shut off central air heating or cooling.
4. Pick up all glass fragments and any powder using a stiff paper or cardboard. Place glass fragments and paper in a glass jar with a metal lid or seal in a plastic bag. (You can use a piece of duct tape to pick up any remaining small glass fragments or powder.)
5. Wipe the area with a clean damp paper towel or disposable wipes. Place the towels in the jar or bag. Do not use a vacuum or broom to clean up the broken bulb unless the bulb broke in carpet and you cannot get all of the pieces. Once completed, remove the vacuum bag or empty and wipe the canister when complete and place the vacuum bag in a zip lock bag.
6. If clothing or bedding materials come in direct contact with broken glass or mercury-containing powder, the clothing or bedding should be thrown away. Do not wash this clothing or bedding because mercury fragments in the clothing may contaminate the machine and/or pollute sewage. If possible this

- material should be placed in a zip lock bag.
7. Immediately place all clean-up materials outdoors in a trash container or protected area for the next normal trash pickup.
8. The next several times you vacuum, shut off the central forced-air conditioning or heating system and open a window before vacuuming.

Leave the window open for at least 15 minutes after vacuuming is completed.

Intact, burned out, CFL bulbs, like regular fluorescent bulbs, should be taken to the Household Chemical Waste Collection events where they can be disposed of correctly.

R Registered to Vote?

E Early Voting

Early voting will be offered to any eligible voter, without reason (i.e. not required to actually be absent, physically disabled, etc.).

Early voting in the Consolidated Election of April 7th begins on Monday, March 16th, and runs through Thursday, April 2nd. Voters are required to present a valid Illinois driver's license, an Illinois identification card issued by the Secretary of State, or any other government-issued identification document containing their photograph, name and address.

Main Street, Buffalo Grove, IL 60089, Telephone # 847-234-0802, on Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and on Saturday between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Contact the Lake County Clerk's office at 847-377-2828 for times if you wish to early vote at the Lake County Building.

A bsentee Voting

In-Person Absentee Voting in the County Clerk's office begins on Friday, March 13th. The last day to Absentee Vote at the County Clerk's office is Thursday, April 2nd. Call the Lake County Clerk's Office at 847-377-2400 for more information.

C andidate Signage

The Village Code regulates the size of political signs. The maximum size for political signs is six square feet, which is the size of a standard 2 x 3 foot sign and it cannot be any higher than four feet off the ground.

All political signs must be displayed no more than thirty-six days prior to and removed within two days after an election. Since the election is on Tuesday, April 7th this year, no political signs should go up before Tuesday, March 2nd and they should be taken down by Thursday, April 9th. Since the waste haulers come through the Village on Wednesday, April 8th, it's a good idea to take the signs out of your yard and put them at the curb at the same time you put out your waste and recycleables.

Signs must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowner. Private property typically begins fifteen feet from the roadway. Rights-of-way along roads such as Riverwoods Road, Route 22 and Milwaukee Avenue are not private property. Any signage along these roadways must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowners. **Any signage not meeting this criteria will be removed by the Village staff.**

What is SWALCO?

The Village is a member of the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO). This agency exists to help reduce the stream of waste headed to our landfills by reduction, recycling and energy recovery. SWALCO sponsors household chemical waste and electronics collections as well as educational programs aimed at improving our environment. Lincolnshire residents recycled 1,011 tons of materials in 2008 - more than 309 pounds per resident.

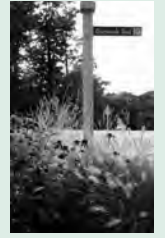
- Is funded through a portion of the tipping fees paid by the garbage trucks at the landfills.

Garden Spot

Celebrity Plant of the Month is Salvia nemorosa 'May Night', or May Night Salvia.

This plant is an excellent selection for a perennial bed in a sunny location with good drainage. It has a bold presence and can also be used as an accent plant in a shrub bed. This is a plant with the intense violet-blue spikes that contrasts so beautifully with the yellow daffodils and the pink moss phlox of our spring gardens. It stands about 18" tall and has fuzzy, blue-green leaves. It requires full sun but will bloom in partial shade. It prefers well drained soil and will not perform well under moist conditions. Because it is a member of the mint family, the leaves give off an odor which keeps deer away—a big plus in Lincolnshire. Also, once the first bloom is spent, the spikes can be cut down to the basal growth and a new crop of purple spikes emerge to accompany summer's roses, coneflowers, and rudbeckia.



It is drought and cold tolerant, divides easily, and has graced Lincolnshire gardens for many years.

Gardening Tip of the Month

Poor soil quality can be the cause of low garden performance. An imbalance in soil pH renders certain nutrients unavailable to plants; saline soil conditions, caused by winter road salt application, can limit a plant's ability to take up water; pedestrian and vehicle traffic can compact soil, making root growth difficult to impossible. A soil test can determine why garden soils are not productive and can give gardeners advice to correct the deficiencies.



The Soil and Water Conservation District of Lake County, located at 100 N. Atkinson Rd., Suite 102A, Grayslake, IL, 60030, provides homeowners with a soil testing service. Residents should fill a bag with a soil sample taken from the top 6"-10" of the garden and take or send it to SWCD, where it will be analyzed. You will receive a report including information to improve the soil.

Scam Alerts From the Chief of Police

Anytime economic growth slows and the unemployment rate goes up, the scam artists go to work. Lately there has been an increase in scams everywhere in the Chicago metropolitan area, Lincolnshire included. While we've all seen the bogus e-mails about the Nigerian bank scams, there is an increase in diversion scams, or ruse entry scams. A ruse entry scam consists of two or more people coming to a residence claiming to be from a utility company, local water/sewer department, or such. They tell the homeowner that there has been a problem in the area, and they need to check their electric or water connections. One person will take the homeowner to a remote part of the home, usually the kitchen or basement, and will act like they are checking the electric or the water by turning off and on the faucets or switches, and at the same time be talking to their partner by two-way radio or cell phone. While the homeowner is being distracted, the other person is going through the home, usually bedrooms, where jewelry and cash are taken. When the theft has been committed, the person tells the homeowner they have to go to their vehicle to get tools or paperwork, and then they leave.

Driveway scams are usually done in one of two ways. The first is in the same manner as a ruse entry burglary except the homeowner is brought outside to a remote part of the driveway by one person while the other person enters the home taking jewelry and cash. The second driveway scam usually is

directed to an elderly homeowner who is told their driveway needs to be sealed or it will deteriorate beyond repair. They will charge the elderly homeowner several hundred or several thousand dollars and tell them that this is a fraction of what a new driveway would cost. The sealant is more fuel oil than sealant, which washes away after one or two rains. Tree trimming, roofing and gutter work scams occur in a similar way.

The most recent monetary phone scams usually originate from Canada. This scam consists of a resident being called by a person claiming to be a relative or a friend of a relative who says he or she has been involved in a traffic accident or has been arrested in Canada. (These people obtain family tree information from various websites on the internet and are able to call family members by their correct names) The person calling says the relative/friend needs several thousand dollars to repair the rental car they were supposedly driving, or for bond so they can be released from custody, or for medical expenses because they are out of the country and their medical insurance won't work. The person usually gives the phone to another who claims to be a Canadian police officer or other legitimate person and directs the homeowner to obtain a money-gram saying he will call back later for the money-gram transfer number. A similar monetary scam occurs when a person calls a resident claiming the resident has won an international lottery and needs to wire transfer money so the winnings can be processed and sent.

If you are in a situation such as these or something similar, do not let anyone in your house until you verify their identity. If they claim to work for the Village of Lincolnshire, ask to see their Village-issued ID card bearing their photograph. Every Village employee is issued a photo ID card. You can also call the Village to confirm the service call. If the person claims to be from Com-Ed, NorthShore Gas, AT&T, Comcast, etc., they too should have identification. **When in doubt, call the Police Department or 911, and we will confirm the person's identity. We would rather respond to 100 false calls than one real call.**

Do not give out any personal information over the telephone or the Internet unless you know, for sure, the other person's identity.

One last crime alert involves portable GPS units. Thieves break into your car, steal the GPS unit, and your remote garage door opener. They activate the GPS, select "home" as the destination, and once they arrive at your house, they use the garage door opener to gain access into your home. To avoid this, use some other designator as your "home" selection on the GPS, and keep the GPS in the trunk or out of sight when not in use.

Snow Plow Damage

Village crews are careful to try to avoid damaging property as they plow the snow, but because the snow can sometimes obscure the line between the curb and the lawn, accidents do happen. If you discover damage to your lawn or mailbox after the snow plows have passed, call Wendy Moderhack, 847-913-2380, Monday through Friday, between 7:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. The Public Works Department will determine if the Village is responsible and will make repairs as soon as possible. However, landscaping restoration cannot be done until the Spring.

- **Dumping in drainage ditches and detention basins** is prohibited by Village Code. A fine will be assessed to anyone in violation. Questions? Call Rob Horne, Engineering Supervisor, at 847-913-2366.
- **Waste Management North is the single waste hauler for most residents in Lincolnshire.** If you have questions or problems, the waste hauler can be reached at 800-796-9696 or 630-724-8400. However, if you are a member of a Homeowners' Association, your home is not necessarily covered by Waste Management North. Check with your Homeowners' Association for more information.
- **If you have any old major appliances you wish to discard, call Environmental Field Service at 800-480-4337.** This service will collect these appliances for a fee that is much lower than what Waste Management North would charge.
- **Problems with Comcast Broadband Cable?** Call its Customer Service Department at 866-594-1234. **Comcast Internet** - call 888-262-6300, and **Comcast Telephone** - call 800-266-2278. **Unburied cable?** If you don't get satisfaction, contact Carol Marshall at the Village of Lincolnshire - 847-913-2334.
