## Recent Board Action

### At its Regular Village Board Meeting of August 24, 2009 the Village Board of Trustees approved:

## Fireplace Tips

Fireplaces add a nice ambience to a room, but they can also cause dangerous fires. Don't take any chances with your family and your home. Follow these fire department tips:



- Schedule an inspection and cleaning of your fireplace by a licensed, professional chimney sweep now. We recommend that this be done annually. Bird nests and blocked flu pipes are a common cause of chimney fires.
- Always close the screen or glass door in front of the fireplace to keep sparks from flying out. Keep all combustibles at least 36 inches away from the fire.
- Make sure the fire is out completely before you go to bed. Dispose of ashes in a metal container, not in plastic or paper bags.
- Never leave children unattended in a room where a fire is burning.
- Burn only dry, well-seasoned hardwoods like maple, elm, oak and birch. Avoid pine, spruce and any wood that is green and moist. Never burn painted or treated lumber. These woods give off poisonous vapors.
- Never use accelerants such as gasoline or lighter fluid to start your fire. Use kindling wood instead.
- Keep your fire moderate in size.
- Never leave the fire unattended.

**Dumping in drainage ditches and detention basins is prohibited by Village Code. A fine will be assessed to anyone in violation!**

# Fall Leaf Collection

The Public Works Department will begin its Annual Leaf Collection Program on Monday, October 5th. Leaves must be placed in the street by noon on Monday of your specified pickup week to guarantee one final collection by Friday. Leaves placed in the street after that final collection is made will not be picked up until your next scheduled week of collection.



## Those Autumn Leaves

Leaf pickup is scheduled for Monday through Friday according to the following schedule:

### West of Riverwoods Road -

Week of October 5-9

Week of October 19-23

Week of November 2-6

Week of November 16-20

Week of November 30-December 4

### East of Riverwoods Road -

Week of October 12-16

Week of October 26-30

Week of November 9-13

Week of November 23-27

Please be careful not to mix foreign materials such as brush, garden waste, tree limbs, vines, lumber, etc. with your leaves. Materials such as these can cause equipment failure or injury to the operator or nearby citizens.

Due to the large volume of leaves, Public Works' crews can only pick up leaves on one side of the Village each week. It is important to follow the schedule and not place leaves in the street for more than two to three days before your scheduled week of pickup. You may rake your leaves and place them on your grass near the curb as shown in the picture, then rake them into the street during your scheduled week. Leaves piled in the street during off-scheduled weeks become a fire hazard and can obstruct drivers' views of children at play. They also block the storm sewer inlets



causing localized flooding. Please notify your landscaper of the Village's leaf pickup schedule if applicable.

## Day Light Savings Time Ends

Don't forget to turn your clocks back one hour Sunday morning, November 1st at 2:00 a.m. or when you go to bed.

It's also a good time to remember to check the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors.



## Did You Know?

The Village of Lincolnshire has specific guidelines that need to be followed when installing recreational equipment on your property. According to Village Code Section 6-3-7, recreational equipment is only permitted to be installed in the rear yard of a resident's home. In regard to this section, recreational equipment pertains to playhouses, jungle gyms, trampolines, and recreational structures which conform to the regulations set forth in Section 6-3-5. Any paved surface associated with this equipment must be a minimum of 5' from your property line. If you have any questions regarding the location of your recreational equipment, or if you have any questions about what is deemed your rear yard due to the location of your home on your property, please feel free to contact Nicole Koleno, Code Enforcement Inspector, at 847-913-2317.

# Trick or Treat Hours

# Halloween Safety Tips

Parents and children should observe the following safety tips on Halloween:

- Before eating treats, have your children bring them home for a parent's inspection.
- Costumes should be light in color, and children should carry flash lights pointed at the ground after dark. Strips of reflective tape on clothes are a good idea. Use makeup instead of masks that can obstruct vision.
- Children should be instructed to be careful when walking in the street or on the lawn near curbs.
- Be sure that your young children are accompanied by an adult or responsible teenager while they are Trick or Treating.
- Know which friends your children will be with and the route they will be taking.
- Children should not enter any home unless it is one of a relative or known friend.
- Children should be respectful and courteous to the property of others.
- Leave your porch light on so children will know they are welcome to visit your home. This will also discourage vandalism.
- Don't invite Trick or Treaters into your home unless you know them.
- Keep pets inside the house or garage on Halloween night.
- Children should not play in or near the piles of leaves near the street.

# Clean Your Grates

Clean your grates! In the fall and spring, and after heavy rains, be sure to check the storm sewer grates on the street by your house and in your yard. Grates clogged with leaves and trash can cause flooding. Please remove the debris away from the grate. If the debris is large, contact Wendy Moderhack at the Public Works Facility at 847-913-2380 to request assistance.



# Sump Pump Discharge

The Village Code requires that residents disconnect sump pump discharges that flow to the street and redirect the flow onto their own property between November 1st and April 1st. This is done to prevent ice buildup in the streets which could create a hazard to both motorists and pedestrians alike, as well as cause excessive damage to our roadways and snow removal equipment.

# Open Gym Starts

The Park Board is again offering an Open Gym Program on Sundays, between October 4th and March 21st, at Half Day School from 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. There will be two gyms available. Children under 12 years old must be accompanied by an adult who must remain on the premises. Basketball may be played. A one-time season release is required before anyone is allowed to participate, and the weekly fee is \$3.00. Releases will also be available at both the Village Hall and during Open Gym. Parents should not drop off children at Half Day School without being sure that releases have been signed.



There will be no Open Gym on October 11, November 29, December 20, December 27, 2009 and January 3, January 17 February 14 and February 28, 2010.
