Fall Brush Collection

On Monday, September 21st the Village will be providing a branch pickup. This is an opportunity for residents to get rid of branches, trimmings or small trees that have been removed. The Village has hired a contractor to drive through the Village and pick up and dispose of this material. There is no fee for this service so this is a great opportunity to cut down and get rid of your buckthorn and other dead or declining woody vegetation.



To participate in this program:

- Only cut branches or trees (smaller than 6 inches) will be collected. (Note that some small twigs and leaves may be too small to be chipped.)
- All cut material to be collected must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m., Monday, September 21st. The contractor will do his best to get it picked up from your property by Friday, September 25th.
- Participants may begin placing material at the curb on Saturday, September 19th. Care should be taken to keep material out of the street. All material must be on the owner's property.
- Branches must be placed perpendicular to the curb with the cut end facing the street. Material may be stacked, but all cut ends must face the street.
- Do not bundle or tie the material together. (If you are placing material at the curb for Waste Management and you have landscape collection, you are required to bundle it. Do not place that material in the same area where you will be placing branches which are being collected by the Village contractor.)
- No root balls, lawn clippings or other landscape waste will be collected.
- In the event of rain there may be a delay in collecting the material. Please note that the material will be picked up as soon as it is possible.
- Be advised that there may be small twigs and leaves left behind. It is the responsibility of the participant to collect and dispose of all material that is too small to be chipped or is left behind.

This program was very successful last year, and we anticipate similar participation in 2009. Your patience during this process will be greatly appreciated. Wastehauler Pick-Up

Because Labor Day falls on Monday, September 7th, single-family residential home's garbage and recyclables will not be picked up by Waste Management on the normal pick-up day, but on Thursday, September 10th.



Fire Hydrant Clearance

The Village of Lincolnshire is asking you to comply with the Illinois Fire Hydrant Act (425ILCS 20/1). This law, which was enacted for better fire service protection, requires a 48 inch clearance around all fire hydrants. Please clear any barriers, trees, bushes, or other obstacles which hide or impede the use of the hydrant. Thank you for your cooperation.

Please ICE Your Cell Phones!

Well, not literally. In case of emergency, paramedics will turn to a victim's cell phone for clues to that person's identity. You can make their job much easier with a simple idea that safety officials are trying to get everyone to adopt: ICE.



ICE stands for "In Case of Emergency". If you add an entry in the contacts list in your cell phone under ICE, with the name and phone number of the person(s) that the emergency services should call on your behalf, you can save them a lot of time and have your loved ones contacted quickly. It will only take a few minutes of your time to do it. Paramedics and fire and police officials know what ICE means and they look for it immediately.

Village is Seeking Nominations for the Excellence In Residential Landscaping Awards

This autumn the Village will be recognizing excellence in residential landscape design and maintenance by presenting awards to the property owners whose landscapes best characterized the beauty of Lincolnshire during the 2009 growing season.

This year an award plaque will be presented for the Best Residential Property Landscape. Award Nominees will be judged based on design, upkeep, and overall visual appeal.

If you would like to nominate your or someone else's landscape for a 2009 Excellence in Landscaping Award, simply follow these three simple steps:

1. Take pictures of the nominated landscape. (Up to six photos may be submitted with each nomination, so be sure to capture the landscape's beauty from all the best angles.)
2. Record the street address and (if possible) the name and phone number of the nominated landscape's property owner.
3. E-mail or deliver the above information to Tony Gliot, the Village Forester, at the Lincolnshire Village Hall (located at One Olde Half Day Road). Tony's email address is: tgliot@village.lincolnshire.il.us.

Nominations for this year's Excellence in Landscaping Awards must be received by Friday, October 2nd. Please note that in order to ensure fair and reasonable competition, the Village will conduct the Awards Program only if there are at least three nominations for this award. There are many qualified landscapes, we have had outstanding winners in the past, and hope to continue this tradition of excellence in the Village's landscape. Senior Citizen Tax Relief

If you are a senior citizen, sixty-five years or older, residing in a single-family residence, individual condominium or townhome upon which you are obligated to pay real estate property taxes, you may be eligible for senior citizen tax relief. The amount to be refunded to you from your Lake County property tax bill will be the dollars paid to the Village of Lincolnshire Pension Funds. To qualify, **your total adjusted gross income (which is the total dollars you receive from any source - dividends, pension, social security, etc.) CANNOT exceed** the number the IRS designates as **the maximum allowable social security benefit a household can receive**. For example, in 2008, the maximum allowable social security benefit was \$41,628. Therefore, to receive the senior citizen tax relief from your 2008 Lake County property tax bill, your total household income cannot be higher than \$41,628.

The application deadline is December 31, 2009.

Alternative Energy Systems

Currently, the Village has placed a moratorium on all applications and requests for permits associated with



alternative energy systems. The Village is anticipating that future requests for the installation of wind and solar-powered generators may increase, and is conducting research to develop an ordinance regarding their potential acceptance as accessory structures. Small residential wind turbines and photovoltaic panels have come a long way in a very short time and can offer a significant amount of energy savings. Although initial costs are still relatively high compared to return on investment, we anticipate that this gap will continue to narrow with technological advancement and federal government subsidies. As part of our research, the Village is looking at how to balance the design and installation of these systems to be aesthetically pleasing so as not to disrupt the character of the Village, yet remain functional allowing residents to enjoy their benefits.

Gypsy Moth Update: Seek and Destroy All Accessible Egg Masses!



As many Lincolnshire residents know, gypsy moth populations throughout the Village (and the entire region) have been on the rise over the past couple years. Areas that, in previous years, showed little or no gypsy moth presence, now have large enough populations to warrant serious control efforts. Fortunately, for the Village of Lincolnshire, our aerial spraying efforts (aimed at limiting tree damage resulting from gypsy moth caterpillars) proved to be very effective.

While the Village currently intends to continue aerial spraying efforts in the coming years, it cannot be overemphasized that **PHYSICAL REMOVAL AND/OR DESTRUCTION IS THE BEST METHOD FOR REDUCING AND CONTROLLING THE GYPSY MOTH POPULATION IN LINCOLNSHIRE.**

From now until May of next year, Gypsy Moths are in the egg stage of their life cycle. You can find the gypsy moth “egg masses” (each containing up to 1,000 individual eggs), affixed to tree trunks, wood piles, house walls, and on just about any other outdoor surface. The egg masses, which are tan colored and fuzzy, measure about 3/4” x 1fi”. Lincolnshire residents who observed gypsy moth caterpillars this summer should seek out all accessible egg masses and destroy them as follows (PLEASE NOTE: Egg mass destruction procedures have changed):

1. Prepare a bucket or other container.
2. Use a knife, pencil, or stick to scrape all accessible egg masses into the container. (Please Note: the egg masses will detach and crumble very easily so be sure that all the tiny eggs make it into the container.)
3. Transfer the collected eggs to a grill, fire pit, or other fire appropriate location and burn them. (If you have a charcoal grill, just throw them on the hot embers. However if you use a gas grill, simply wrap them in tin foil and let them cook for a few minutes.)
4. **DO NOT ATTEMPT TO CRUSH THE EGG MASSES** (They are very hard and numerous, and you will inevitably miss thousands of them.)
5. **DO NOT SOAK EGG MASSES IN WATER.** While this used to be an accepted method of destroying gypsy moth eggs, recent studies have shown that many eggs may survive the soap bath.

Gypsy Moths will never be completely eradicated from Lincolnshire, but with a little bit of effort, you can ensure that the trees on your property are safe from this destructive pest.

Garden Spot

Celebrity plant of the month is Chelone lyonii, or Turtle Head.

Just when you thought pink perennial blooms had left the landscape and would not return again until the first spring flush of pink creeping phlox made its appearance, Chelone buds open, revealing a lovely, hooded, pink-lilac flower. These snapdragon-like flowers are borne in clusters on stiff, erect stems and can reach a height of 3’. The dark, glossy green leaves provide a great contrast to the flowers and bring a fresh, rejuvenated look to the fall garden. Another desirable feature of this hardy perennial is its ability to tolerate a fair amount of shade. Look for Turtle Heads in the Village Streetscape at the corner of Oxford Drive and Route 22.

Garden tip of the month: WATER! WATER! WATER!

This summer’s lower than average temperatures, frequent cloudy days, and occasional cloud bursts are not indications that landscape plantings do not require water. The fact is that established plants require 1” of water per day, whether from the skies or the spigot, well into late autumn. Newly planted beds require more. Use a rain gauge or can to measure how much rain or sprinkler water the garden is getting. Here are a few watering tips to consider:

1. One long, deep soak is better than frequent, shallow watering for most established plants.
2. Because air temperature and soil type affect the water retention capabilities of the soil, move the thin top layer of soil away from the plant crown and test the soil down to 1” with your fingers. If the soil is dry and crumbly, the plant needs more water; if the soil is soggy, the plant has too much water; if the soil is moist, the plant has sufficient water.
3. The best time to water is in the morning. In the afternoon, the air is warmer and water is evaporated. Watering in the evenings allows moisture to remain on leaves, creating a breeding ground for disease.

When You Empty Your Pool...



Before you empty your swimming pool for the season, please remember to dechlorinate the water before discharging it into the environment. This important step protects plants and animal life. Not only that, it is required by law. Dechlorination can be achieved by simply not adding chlorine to the water and letting the water sit for several days in the sun before draining the pool.

Alternatively, you may use one of the products on the market which will neutralize the chlorine. You can contact your chlorine supplier to get more information on these chemicals.

Road Construction on Route 22 and US45/IL21 (Milwaukee Avenue)

After many years of construction, it looks like there is light at the end of the tunnel. The Illinois Department of Transportation began the work on the reconstruction of the intersection at Route 22 and US45/IL21 (Milwaukee Avenue) in Lincolnshire on August 3, 2009. This is the last section of work on a road widening and improvement project that extends from the Tollway at the eastern limits to Route 83 at the western limits. The project involves the construction of a new concrete pavement that will add turn lanes on Route 22, drainage improvements, traffic signal upgrades and path construction. The ultimate configuration will be as follows:

- Route 22 Eastbound: Dual left turn lanes, dual eastbound lanes, single right turn lane
- Route 22 Westbound: Dual left turn lanes, dual westbound lanes, single right turn lane
- Route 21 Northbound: Single extended left turn lane, dual northbound lanes, single right turn lane
- Route 21 Southbound: Single extended left turn lane, dual southbound lanes, single right turn lane

As part of the reconstruction of intersection at Route 22 and US45/IL21 (Milwaukee Avenue), the contractor will be moving into the next stage of construction shortly. This will include pavement removal, temporary pavement installation, and the installation of temporary traffic signals. As part of that work, the contractor will be modifying the traffic patterns at the intersection.

The projected completion for this project remains July 2010.

Please pay attention to the posted signage, as changes to the traffic patterns may take place at any time.

Due to the impact of the construction at this intersection, we strongly recommend allowing extra time to get through the construction zone, or consider alternate routes. As always, the Village will pass along information as it is provided.

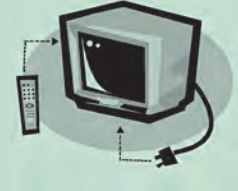

Village Electronics Collection Event



On October 3rd, the Village will be offering an Electronics Collection Event in connection with the Village Open House to be held at the Public Works Facility, 205 Schelter Road. The collection will begin at 11:00 a.m. and end at 2:00 p.m.

Items which will be accepted include:

personal computers, monitors, computer drives, keyboards, modems, mainframes, scanners, printers, any type of telephone, televisions, stereos, MP3 players, CD players, DVD players, cameras, video games, fax machines, shredders, small household appliances, holiday lights, microwave ovens, etc.

Items which will NOT be accepted include:

broken glass, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, large household appliances, lead-acid batteries, electric fixtures, fluorescent light bulbs, compact disks, software disks, tapes, liquid or chemical waste, and packaging.

Please be sure that anything brought to the collection event is out of its packaging. No packaging materials will be accepted.

If you are regularly filling your recycling toter cart, it is now possible to get a larger toter cart at no additional charge. The size of your current recycling toter cart is 64 gallons. The size of the new recycling toter cart is 96 gallons. 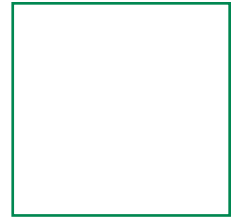

Important Information

- **Sprinkling Restrictions** - Outside water usage is restricted in the Village between May 15th and September 15th. If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8), then you may use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), you may use outside water on calendar days which are odd.
- **Dumping in drainage ditches and detention basins** is prohibited by Village Code. A fine will be assessed to anyone in violation. Questions? Call Rob Horne, Engineering Supervisor, at 847-913-2366.
- **Waste Management North is the single waste hauler for most residents in Lincolnshire.** If you have questions or problems, the waste hauler can be reached at 800-796-9696 or 630-724-8400. However, if you are a member of a Homeowners' Association, your home is not necessarily covered by Waste Management North. Check with your Homeowners' Association for more information.
- **If you have any old major appliances you wish to discard, call Environmental Field Service at 800-480-4337.** This service will collect these appliances for a fee that is much lower than what Waste Management North would charge.
- **Problems with Comcast Broadband Cable?** Call its Customer Service Department at 866-594-1234. **Comcast Internet** - call 888-262-6300, and **Comcast Telephone** - call 800-266-2278. **Unburied cable?** If you don't get satisfaction, contact Carol Marshall at the Village of Lincolnshire - 847-913-2334.
- **North Park Hot Line** - On days with questionable weather, call the North Park Hot Line for field conditions at 847-913-2375.
- **Drop Mail Box at the Village Hall** - If you need to mail something to the Village, it might be easier (and less expensive) to drop it off at the Village Hall. There is a "Drop Box" in the circle at the front of the Village Hall, One Olde Half Day Road. Staff checks it daily.
- **Flood Insurance Rate Maps** - The FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps are available at the Village Hall for public review. Call Rob Horne, Engineering Supervisor, at 847-913-2366.
- **Flood Information Available** - Technical advice on how to protect your home from flooding is available at the Village Hall. Come in to view available resources, or call Rob Horne, Engineering Supervisor, at 847-913-2366.
- **Benchmarks Available** - The Village of Lincolnshire has obtained elevation reference marks (benchmarks) for several locations throughout the Village. If you plan to have survey work done, or are interested in knowing the elevation of the marker closest to your property, please call Rob Horne, Engineering Supervisor, at 847-913-2366.
